CHAPTER 220—H. F. No. 945.

(AMENDING SECTION 84.10 MINNESOTA STATUTES 1941.)

An act relating to wild rice, declaring the continuance of an emergency, and amending Mason's Supplement 1940, Section 6131-5, as amended by Laws 1941, Chapter 217.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Law amended.**—Mason's Supplement 1940, Section 6131-5, as amended by Laws 1941, Chapter 217, Section 1, is hereby amended to read as follows:

“6131-5. **Wild rice harvested in certain lakes by Indians only.**—*The legislature of the state of Minnesota hereby declares that the emergency heretofore found, continues to exist in the state, and therefor it shall be unlawful prior to November 1, 1945, for any person to take wild rice grain from any of the waters within the original boundaries of the White Earth, Leach Lake, Nett Lake, Vermillion, Grand Portage, Fondulac and Mille Laes Reservations except said persons be of Indian blood, or residents of the reservation upon which said wild rice grain is taken.*”

CHAPTER 221—S. F. No. 443.

An act fixing the salaries of county commissioners, county auditor, county treasurer, and probate judge in certain counties; and amending Laws 1933, Chapter 16, as amended.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Law amended.**—Laws 1933, Chapter 16, Section 1, as amended by Laws 1937, Chapter 69, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. **Salaries of county officers in certain counties.**—In each county of this state now or hereafter containing not less than 81 nor more than 85 full and fractional congressional town-

ships and a population of not less than 18,000 nor more than 30,000 inhabitants according to the last preceding federal or state census, the several members of the county board shall receive a salary of \$720 per year, the county auditor shall receive a salary of \$2,750 per year, the county treasurer shall receive a salary of \$2,100.00 per year and the judge of probate court shall receive a salary of \$2,100 per year. The salary of each of said officers shall be payable monthly.

All fees paid to the probate court or to the judge of the probate court of any such county, as provided by law, shall be turned over to the county and credited to the county revenue fund.

CHAPTER 222—S. F. No. 513.

(AMENDING SECTION 212.34, MINNESOTA STATUTES 1941.)

An act relating to elections in villages and providing for the election of village assessors in even-numbered years; amending Mason's Supplement 1940, Section 601-11 (2) f, and Laws 1943, Chapter 117, Section 3.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Law amended.**—Mason's Supplement 1940, Section 601-11(2)f is amended to read as follows:

601-11(2)f. **Village officers.**—In all of the villages of this state the resident electors shall choose the following named officers under the provisions of this act, namely: a treasurer, two constables, and a council composed of a president, a clerk, and three trustees; and, if said village is a separate election district, an assessor, *who shall be elected in each even numbered year; and, if there be no municipal court established in such village, two justices of the peace, provided that the term of all village assessors now in office shall extend to and expire on the first secular day of January, 1945, and no village assessors shall be elected in 1943.* All officers chosen and qualified as such shall hold office until their successors qualify. Vacancies in office may be filled, for the remainder of the term for which said respective officers were elected, by the council; if the council because of equal division of the vote is unable to fill the vacancy then the president of the council shall fill the vacancy by appointment for the unexpired term.
