

enforced in like manner as state and county taxes are collected and the payment thereof enforced.

(c) The city treasurer, when the tax is received by him, shall pay the same over to the treasurer of the duly incorporated firemen's relief association of such city, if there is one organized, together with all penalties and interest collected thereon; but if there is no firemen's relief association so organized in any such city, or if any such association resign, be dissolved or removed, or any successor of such association resign, be removed or has heretofore resigned or has been removed as trustee of such money, then the treasurer of such municipality shall keep the money in a special fund to be disbursed only for the purpose authorized by this act.

CHAPTER 361—H. F. No. 1027.

An act relating to the salaries of county commissioners in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Salary of county board in certain counties.—In all counties with an assessed valuation of less than \$1,500,000 and containing more than 10,000 inhabitants, the salary of each county commissioner shall be \$360.00 per annum.

CHAPTER 362—H. F. No. 1038.

An act relating to the salaries of the county auditor and county commissioners in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Salary of county board and county auditor in certain counties.—In any county having a population of more than 10,000 and less than 11,000 inhabitants, and having a land area of less than 500 square miles, and having less than 12 full and fractional congressional townships, the salary of the county auditor shall be \$2,400 per annum and the salary of each commissioner shall be \$375.00 per annum.
