CHAPTER 383—S. F. No. 1081.

An act relating to the salaries of county officials in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Salaries of county officers in certain counties.—In all counties in this State having not less than 20 nor more than 22 full or fractional congressional townships, and having a population of not less than 20,500 nor more than 21,500 inhabitants, and having an assessed valuation of not less than \$13,000,000 nor more than \$20,000,000 exclusive of money and credits, the salary of each County Commissioner shall be \$800.00 per annum, provided, however, that the salary shall revert to \$600.00 six months after the cessation of present hostilities.

CHAPTER 384—S. F. No. 1088.

An act authorizing the sale of a parcel of real estate in Pipestone county.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Governor to convey real estate in Pipestone county.—The Governor, upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of Highways, is authorized to convey to the City of Pipestone by quit claim deed upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon, a part of that 4-acre tract of land in the Northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 13, township 106 north, range 46 west, Pipestone County, described as follows:

Commencing at a point on the north line of said section 13, 60 rods west of the northeast corner of said section; thence west along said north section line, 20 rods; thence south, 32 rods; thence east, 20 rods; thence north 32 rods to place of beginning.

CHAPTER 385—S. F. No. 1093.

An act relating to the salary and clerk hire in the office of the county treasurer in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Salary of County Treasurer in certain Counties.—In all counties of this state having a population of not less than 25,000 nor more than 26,000, according to the Federal census of 1940, and having an area of not less nor more than 24 full or fractional townships, the Board of County Commissioners shall fix the salary of the county treasurer at not less than \$2,500 and not more than \$3,000 per annum.

Sec. 2. Clerk hire.—In all such counties there shall be allowed for clerk hire in the office of the county treasurer the sum of \$200 per year in addition to the amount now provided by law.

CHAPTER 386—S. F. No. 1100.

An act permitting certain counties to pay all or part of the rent for farm security administration offices located therein and legalizing payments therefor hertofore made.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Certain counties may pay rent for farm security administration offices.—In any county in this state now or here-
