

CHAPTER 8—S. F. No. 25

An act relating to public lands and authorizing sale of certain buildings.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Commissioner of Conservation may sell buildings.—The Commissioner of Conservation may sell, at public or private vendue, at their fair salvage value, any buildings or lands under the jurisdiction of the Division of Forestry which were constructed during the years 1933 to 1937, as improvements to subsistence farms and for which buildings no use has been found.

Sec. 2. To be sold—when.—Before offering such buildings for sale, the Commissioner of Conservation shall find upon the recommendation of the Director of Forestry that no present conservation use for such buildings exists or is likely to occur.

Sec. 3. Commissioner to execute transfers.—The Commissioner of Conservation is hereby authorized to execute such instruments as may be necessary to transfer ownership of such buildings upon forms approved by the Attorney General.

Sec. 4. Proceeds to general revenue fund.—The proceeds of all such sales shall be credited to the General Revenue Fund of the state.

CHAPTER 9—S. F. No. 47

An act relating to the powers of county commissioners in certain counties to annually levy a tax to provide for the construction or reconstruction of county buildings, and for other purposes, and amending Laws of 1941, Chapter 226, Section 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Law amended.—Laws of 1941, Chapter 226, Section 1, is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 1. **County Board may levy tax for Court House purposes.**—The board of county commissioners in any county in this state now or hereafter having a population of not less than 25,000 nor more than 27,000, according to the 1940 federal census,
