

CHAPTER 80—S. F. No. 204

An act to validate and legalize certain warrants or orders issued by towns which were dissolved prior to July 11, 1934, in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Certain town warrants and orders legalized.—In any county in this state having an area of not less than 101 full or fractional townships and a taxable valuation as of 1941, exclusive of money and credits, of not less than \$2,800,000 and not more than \$3,000,000 all warrants or orders, drawn and issued, by any town which was dissolved prior to July 11, 1934, upon any fund or by any department of such town, are hereby legalized and declared valid obligations of said town.

Sec. 2. County to pay warrants and orders.—Payment may be made by the county of all such warrants or orders, together with accrued interest thereon at the rate of not more than six per cent per annum from the date of issue to July 10, 1934.

Sec. 3. County Board to levy tax.—In the event there are no funds in the county treasury for the payment of such warrants or orders, the county board shall make and cause to be extended upon the tax list a levy sufficient to meet such obligations, but such levies shall be made upon the territory formerly included in such townships, and such warrants or orders shall not be general obligations of the county.

CHAPTER 81—S. F. No. 290

An act relating to the salary and clerk hire of county auditors in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Salary and clerk hire of county auditor in certain counties.—In each county of this state containing not less than 18, nor more than 20, full and fractional congressional townships, and having a population of not less than 36,000 nor more than 36,500 inhabitants, according to the last preceding federal census, and having an assessed valuation of all property, including money and credits, as last fixed by the tax commission, of not less
