tion as provided in sections 282.15 and 282.16, upon first having been reclassified and re-appraised as provided by section 282.14.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1941, Section 282.19, is hereby amended to read as follows:

County treasurer to collect payments. The county treasurer shall collect all payments made under sections 282.14 to 282.22 and place the same in a special fund and forthwith submit to the conservation commissioner a receipt specifying the name and address of the person making the payment and the date and amount thereof, whether for principal, timber, improvements or interest, the fund to which it is applicable, and the number of the certificate. Such receipt shall be countersigned by the auditor of such county, and shall have the same force and effect as if given by the state treasurer. The county treasurer shall report all collections to the commissioner of conservation on June 30 and December 31 of each year and at such other times when requested by the commissioner. There shall be transferred from such special fund to the revenue fund of the county the cost of giving the notices herein required and there shall be paid from such fund to the members of the county board, upon warrant of the county auditor, \$3.00 per day for each day necessarily consumed in the classification and appraisal of the lands under sections 282.14 to 282.22 and mileage at the rate of five cents per mile for necessary travel. The amount remaining in the fund shall be transmitted by the county treasurer to the commissioner of conservation as of June 30 and December 31 each year, and at such other times when requested by the commissioner, and disposed of as provided by the laws governing the funds derived from the respective areas in which the lands sold were situated.

CHAPTER 382-S. F. No. 648

An act relating to public lands and the sale thereof, amending Minnesota Statutes 1941, Section 92.24.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1941, Section 92.24, is hereby amended to read as follows:

92.24. Moneys paid to state treasurer. Each county treasurer shall hold all moneys received by him on account of such certificates of sale subject to the order of the state treasurer and as of June 30 and December 31 each year and at other times when requested by the state treasurer he shall pay into the state treasury all such moneys received since the last payment made.

CHAPTER 383-S. F. No. 740

An act regulating traffic on highways and defining the power of local authorities to enact or enforce ordinances, rules, or regulations in regard to matters embraced within the provisions of this act, and amending Minnesota Statutes 1941, Section 169.03.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1941, Section 169.03, is amended to read as follows:

169.03. Application. The provisions of this chapter applicable to the drivers of vehicles upon the highways shall apply to the drivers of all vehicles owned or operated by the United States, this state, or any county, city, town, district, or any other political subdivision of the state, subject to such specific exemptions as are set forth in this chapter with reference to authorized emergency vehicles.

The driver of any authorized emergency vehicle, when responding to an emergency call, upon approaching a red or stop signal or any stop sign, shall slow down as necessary for safety, but may proceed cautiously past such red or stop sign or signal after sounding siren and displaying red lights.

No driver of any authorized emergency vehicle shall assume any special privilege under this chapter except when such vehicle is operated in response to any emergency call or in the immediate pursuit of an actual or suspected violator of the law.

The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to persons, teams, motor vehicles, and other equipment while actually
