

Sec. 3. **Veterans service officer.** In the event the county board of any such county appoints a veterans' service officer, such veterans' referral center and all officers and employees thereof and all other persons serving in or acting for or on behalf of such veterans' referral center who shall aid, or undertake to aid, any resident of such county in securing benefits provided by law on account of the service of any person in the Army, Navy or Marine Corps from which he has a discharge other than dishonorable shall be subject to the direction and control of the veterans' service officer.

CHAPTER 500—S. F. No. 1345

An act to appropriate money for the payment of claims against the State of Minnesota; to provide for tax and other refundments; to provide for the reimbursement and compensation of certain employes of the state having claims for personal injuries sustained or for loss or damage of property incurred while engaged in the performance of their duties and for the relief of dependents of certain employes of the state for the death of such employes while engaged in the performance of their duties; to provide for the reimbursement and compensation of persons for injuries sustained or for loss or damage to property by certain employes of the state while engaged in the performance of their duties; and by inmates of state institutions; and to provide payments to certain persons for services performed in the state; to authorize the State Auditor to cancel certain land and other contracts heretofore entered into by certain persons with the state and to credit payments heretofore made upon other purchases or to refund same; to reimburse certain persons for deeds to certain land erroneously conveyed by the state; to authorize the auditor to credit on certain land contracts the value of improvements found not to be made on said land; to provide money for carrying on certain state activities as authorized by law; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of Game and Fish Department funds; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of rural credits department funds; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of Department of Agriculture funds; to authorize and direct

certain claims to be paid out of the Adjutant General's funds; and for other purposes out of other funds; and re-appropriating certain balances.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Appropriation for miscellaneous claims. The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act to be available for the year ending June 30, 1945, unless otherwise specified.

That the Regents shall pay to Mary Witham each month during the remainder of her life, or until she has recovered from her injuries as determined by the Dean of the College of Medicine of the University of Minnesota or such doctor or doctors on the staff of such hospital as the Dean may designate, the sum of \$50.00, which shall be paid to her on the first day of each month.

2. That the Regents shall provide for Mary Witham at the University Hospital hospitalization, nursing, medical care, drugs, appliances, and all other things incidental to the treat-

ment of her injuries, during the remainder of her life or until she has recovered from her injuries as determined in the manner prescribed in paragraph 1 hereof.

3. If Mary Witham elects to leave the University hospital temporarily or permanently in such case the Regents may pay to her during her said absence a monthly sum to be fixed by the Dean of Medical College or such other person as may be designated by the Regents in an amount not to exceed \$250.00 in lieu of providing to her the things mentioned in paragraph 2 hereof.

4. That all payments to Mary Witham made pursuant to the provisions of this act shall be made from the appropriations now or hereafter made to the University of Minnesota for maintenance.
