

may refrain from publishing the names of persons receiving poor relief or direct relief and the amounts paid to each, but the totals of the disbursements for such purposes must be published. In addition to the publication thereof in the newspaper designated by the board as the official newspaper for publication of the financial statement, the same shall be published in one other newspaper of the county, located in a different section of the county than the official newspaper. The county board shall call for separate bids for each publication. At its meeting in July and January each year it shall examine and count all the funds in the treasury, examine the accounts and vouchers of the auditor and treasurer, and make a written certificate of the condition of the treasury, showing the amount, kind, and character of the funds therein, and all other matters in connection therewith and file the same with the auditor. In so far as any provision of this section is inconsistent with the provisions of section 393.07, the provisions of that section shall prevail.

CHAPTER 236—S. F. No. 490

An act relating to the adoption of zoning regulations by certain town boards; amending Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 366.10.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 366.10, is amended to read as follows:

366.10. **Certain town boards may adopt zoning regulations.** The board of supervisors of any town in this state located within a county having a population of more than 450,000 and an assessed valuation in 1935, exclusive of money and credits, of over \$280,000,000, and the board of supervisors in any town of this state *located within a county* bordering on any city of the first, second, or third class, is hereby authorized and empowered to submit to the legal voters of the town for their approval or rejection at any annual town meeting or at any special town meeting called for that purpose, the question as to whether or not such board shall adopt building and zoning regulations and restrictions in the town.
