

CHAPTER 348—S. F. No. 886

An act to authorize certain common school districts to incur indebtedness in excess of the limit provided by Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 475.23.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. Certain school districts authorized to issue bonds. Any common school district having an area in excess of 6,400 acres and which includes a village having a population of less than 1,000 but whose territory is contiguous to the territory of a city having a population in excess of 40,000 and in which the assessed value of real and personal property for purposes of taxation is less than \$250,000, may incur indebtedness and issue bonds pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1945, Chapter 475, but in excess of the limit of indebtedness provided by Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 475.23, for the purpose of acquiring land and building, furnishing and equipping a school house to provide educational facilities of the district.

Sec. 2. Prerequisite conditions. No bonds shall be issued unless approved by a majority of the voters of the district voting on the question at an election therein nor until the State Board of Education has determined that the construction of such school building is necessary to provide adequate educational facilities. A village shall be deemed adjacent to said city although its territory may be separated therefrom by a navigable river.

CHAPTER 349—S. F. No. 909

An act relating to county sanatorium commission; amending Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 376.35.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 376.35, is amended to read as follows :

376.35. Gifts. Subdivision 1. County sanatorium may accept gift from county in which located. The county sanatorium commission is empowered to accept in the name of
