

CHAPTER 536—H. F. No. 827

An act relating to noxious bushes and weeds; amending Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 20.01, Subdivisions 5 and 7, and Section 20.12, Subdivision 2.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 20.01, Subdivision 5, is amended to read as follows:

20.01. **Definitions.** Subd. 5. "*Noxious weeds*" means the annual, biennial, and perennial plants herein named under Classes I and II and such other plants as are or may be injurious to public health, public roads, crops, livestock and other property.

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 20.01, Subdivision 7, is amended to read as follows:

Subd. 7. The term "*primary noxious weeds*" means and refers to field bindweed (creeping Jenny) (*Convolvulus arvensis*), leafy spurge (*Euphorbia esula*), horse nettle (*Solanum carolinense*), Austrian field cress (*Roripa austriaca*), perennial pepper grass (*Lepidium draba*), *wild radish* (*Raphanus Raphanistrum*), and other similar weeds propagated by seed and root stalk.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 20.12, Subdivision 2, is amended to read as follows:

20.12. Duties of local weed inspectors. Subd. 2. Transportation regulations. When any person desires to transport materials containing leafy spurge, horse nettle, Austrian field cress, *field bindweed* (creeping Jenny), perennial pepper grass, or *wild radish*, county weed inspectors are authorized to issue a permit to regulate the moving of such materials and to regulate such movement and to require proper treatment, cleaning, sterilization or destruction of any such material which has been or is about to be moved or deposited.

No grain seed or screenings containing leafy spurge, horse nettle, Austrian field cress, *field bindweed* (creeping Jenny), perennial pepper grass, or *wild radish* weed seeds shall be transported upon any public highway unless it be in sacks, boxes, or other containers sufficiently closed or covered with canvas or otherwise to prevent weed seeds from blowing or scattering along the highway.

CHAPTER 537—H. F. No. 1101

An act relating to taxation of homesteads; amending Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 273.13, by adding a new subdivision.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 273.13, is amended by adding a new subdivision as follows:

273.13. Classification of property. Subd. 12. Real estate purchased for occupancy as a homestead. *Real estate purchased for occupancy as a homestead shall be classified in class 3b or 3c, as the case may be, where the purchaser is prevented from obtaining possession on May 1st next following the purchase by reason of federal or state rent control laws or regulations. The assessor shall require proof by affidavit from the purchaser of the existence of facts entitling the purchaser to benefits under this section.*
