

(3) To take fish *by angling*, \$1.50;

(4) Sportsmen's license, to include the *privilege of taking small game, fish by angling, deer with firearms and bow and arrows, and spearing fish from a dark house*, \$8.50, plus any additional fee the licensee, at his option, desires to pay;

(5) Combination husband and wife, to take fish *by angling*, \$2.00;

(6) To take moose, \$5.25.

Sec. 2. Laws 1949, Chapter 18, Subdivision 15, is amended to read as follows:

Subd. 15. Fees for the following licenses, to be issued to non-residents, shall be:

(1) To take fish *by angling*, \$4.00;

Sec. 3. **Effective date.** The provisions of this act relating to an increase in the license fee to be issued to residents only for the purpose of taking fish by angling and for an increase in the resident license fee for a combination license issued to husband and wife to take fish by angling, and the provisions relating to increasing the non-resident license fee to take fish by angling, shall take effect January 1, 1950.

CHAPTER 650—S. F. No. 1655

*An act to appropriate money for the payment of claims against the state of Minnesota; to provide for tax and other refundments; to provide for reimbursement and compensation of certain employees of the state having claims for personal injuries sustained or for loss or damage of property incurred while employees were engaged in the performance of their duties and for the relief of dependents of certain employees of the state for the death of such employees while engaged in the performance of their duties; to provide for the*

*reimbursement and compensation of persons for injuries sustained or for loss or damage to property by certain employees of the state while engaged in the performance of their duties; and by inmates of state institutions; and to provide payments to certain persons for services performed in the state; to authorize the state auditor to cancel certain land and other contracts heretofore entered into by certain persons with the state and to credit payments heretofore made upon other purchases or to refund same; to provide money for carrying on certain state activities as authorized by law; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of game and fish department funds; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of department of agriculture funds; and for other purposes out of other funds; permitting suits against the state of Minnesota in certain cases; and reappropriating certain balances.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Section 1. Appropriated for miscellaneous claims.** The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary are hereby appropriated from any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act to be available for the year ending June 30, 1949, unless otherwise specified:

Provided, however, that the attorney general may settle and compromise said claims, and in the event of refusal to pay or settle any of said claims the state waives immunity from suit in connection with such claims if such suit is brought against the State of Minnesota within six months from the effective date of this act by service of process upon the attorney

general and hereby confers jurisdiction on the district courts of the state to hear and try suits upon said claims upon compliance with the conditions above set forth, and in any suit brought thereon the state shall be entitled to interpose any legal or equitable defenses thereto and shall not be required to pay such claims nor any part thereof except as may be duly adjudged in an action brought as above provided, with the right of appeal as in other cases.

The above waiver of immunity shall be effective only if the County of Faribault is made a party defendant in any action which may be brought upon any claim set forth above.

Provided, however, that the attorney general may agree with Andrew and Elizabeth Dolny on the percentage of their dependency on Edward G. Dolny, and in the event of their failure to agree there-



on with the attorney general, the state waives immunity from suit solely for the purpose of determining the percentage, if any, of the dependency of Andrew and Elizabeth Dolny on their son, Edward G. Dolny, if such suit is brought within six months from the effective date of this act by service of a summons and complaint upon the attorney general and hereby confers jurisdiction on the district courts to hear and try said suit upon compliance with the conditions set forth above; and that by accepting any payments hereunder the said Andrew and Elizabeth Dolny agree to reimburse the state for all payments made to them if the United States of America shall compensate them for the death of Edward G. Dolny, and that the state payments shall cease when the federal payment is granted as provided for. The Adjutant General is charged with the duty of delivering the warrants for payment.

Sec. 85. To reimburse the appropriate trust funds under the control of the State Board of Investment for the principal of the delinquent loans made to the townships in the counties hereinafter named in the amounts set opposite their respective names:

In Pine County:

Town of Belden .....	\$16,600.00

On condition that the State Board of Investment accept the several amounts set forth above as payment in full of the principal of the respective loans and cancellation of the unpaid interest on such loans and on other state loans as follows:

Town of Keene ..... 2,360.00

all of which the State Board of Investment is authorized and empowered to do. Upon receipt of a copy of the resolution of the State Board of Investment accepting the above payments on the above conditions the state auditor shall transfer said amounts from the general revenue fund to the appropriate trust funds as directed by the State Board of Investment, and thereupon the State Board of Investment shall cancel and return to the several towns the bonds or other evidences of such indebtedness held by it.

Sec. 86. To reimburse Second Lieutenant Donald G. Nordlie, Infantry, Minnesota National Guard, for 61 armory drills ..... \$ 192.15

Sec. 87. To reimburse Lois Johnson for medical, hospital, and sickness expenses and wage loss incurred as the result of contracting tuberculosis while employed as a student nurse at the University of Minnesota and its affiliated hospitals, and for that purpose the state hereby waives immunity from suit, if such suit is brought against the State of Minnesota under the workmen's compensation laws within six months from the effective date of this act by service of process in the manner provided by said workmen's compensation laws. The state hereby consents to such suit, and in any suit brought hereunder the state shall be entitled to interpose any legal defenses available to it under the provisions of said workmen's compensation laws, except a defense based on a statute of limitations.

Sec. 88. **Effective date.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
