

## RESOLUTION No. 8—H. F. No. 1342

*A joint resolution memorializing Congress to extend the rights and privileges of Veterans of World War II under Title V of the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944.*

WHEREAS, the right of most Veterans of World War II to receive readjustment allowances under Title V of the Federal Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944 (known as the "G. I. Bill of Rights") expires July 25, 1949; and,

WHEREAS, only about one-half of unemployed Minnesota Veterans of World War II have rights to benefits under the Minnesota Employment and Security Law; and,

WHEREAS, unemployment amongst Minnesota Veterans is increasing; and,

WHEREAS, economic conditions in the near future may be such as to cause great hardship and financial distress to such Veterans and their families,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Legislature of the State of Minnesota do herewith memorialize and petition the 81st Congress of the United States of America now in session in the City of Washington, D. C., to extend the rights and privileges of Veterans of World War II under Title V of the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the President of the United States, the Vice President, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to each Congressman and Senator from the State of Minnesota.

## RESOLUTION No. 9—S. F. No. 1291

*A concurrent resolution memorializing the Congress of the United States to amend the Federal Income Tax Law.*
