

## CHAPTER 174—S. F. No. 725

*An act relating to the office of chief of police in any city of the fourth class organized under any special or general law and having a population of not less than 500 nor more than 1,000 and not operating under a home rule charter; repealing Laws 1937, Chapter 68.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1937, Chapter 68, is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 175—H. F. No. 4

*An act relating to supplementary birth certificates for adopted children; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 144.176, Subdivision 1.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 144.176, Subdivision 1, is amended to read:

144.176. **Adoption.** Subdivision 1. **Supplementary birth certificate.** In cases of adoption the state registrar upon receipt of a certified copy of an order or decree of adoption shall prepare a supplementary certificate in the new name of the adopted person, *and such supplementary birth certificate shall show the place of birth at the then residence of the adopting parents,* and seal and file the original certificate of birth with said certified copy attached thereto. Such sealed documents may be opened only upon order of the court or, if otherwise found necessary, by the state registrar. Upon the receipt of a certified copy of a court order of annulment of adoption the state registrar shall restore the original certificate to its original place in the file.
