shall appoint at packing plants, slaughtering houses, and concentration points where the average daily number of livestock slaughtered or handled is 250 head or more, such weighers as may be necassary for weighing livestock, provided that no weighers shall be appointed at packing plants or slaughtering houses at which the only livestock slaughtered or handled is purchased or acquired at a public stockyard as defined by section 225.01. The commission shall prescribe and follow such reasonable regulations as it deems necessary for determining such daily average. Such weighers shall weigh all livestock coming to these places for sale and keep a record thereof. Upon request the weighers shall furnish the interested parties a certificate setting forth the number of animals weighed and the actual weight of such animal or animals. Such certificate shall be prima facie evidence of the facts therein certified. The scales at all such places on which livestock is weighed shall be constructed and maintained in accordance with requirements of the department of weights and measures, and be tested up to the maximum draft that may be weighed thereon by the department of weights and measures at least once every 30 days.

An act appropriating money for the state compensation revolving fund; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 176.81, Subdivision 5.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 176.81, Subdivision 5, is amended to read:

176.81 Subd. 5. There is hereby appropriated from the general revenue fund in the state treasury to the state compensation revolving fund the sum of \$100,000 to be used in connection with the payment of workmen's compensation claims of employees of the state, which, with the sum of \$74,013.12 heretofore appropriated from the trunk highway fund of the department of highways in the state treasury to

the state compensation revolving fund to be used in connection with the payment of workmen's compensation claims of employees of the department of highways and, with \$175,986.88 already appropriated, totals \$350,000, the latter sum to constitute the state compensation revolving fund and to be used and maintained as herein provided.

CHAPTER 232—S. F. No. 101 [Not Coded]

An act to fix the salaries of certain county officers of any county having not less than 70,000 nor more than 100,000 inhabitants according to the last federal census; amending Laws 1949, Chapter 270, Section 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1949, Chapter 270, Section 1, is amended to read:

Section 1. County officers, salaries fixed by county board. In any county having not less than 70,000 nor more than 100,000 inhabitants according to the last federal census, the salary of the County Auditor shall be \$5,100 per year, and the salaries of the Sheriff, County Attorney, Superintendent of Schools, County Treasurer, Judge of Probate, Register of Deeds, and the Clerk of District Court shall be \$6,000 per year.

Sec. 2. This act shall be effective from and after January 1, 1951.
