CHAPTER 370—S. F. No. 1159 [Not Coded]

An act relating to deputy clerks attending court in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Stearns county; deputy clerks of court to attend court. In any county having not less than 70,000 nor more than 100,000 inhabitants according to the last federal census, the judge of district court, before the commencement of any general term, may by order issued to the clerk of court require him to furnish a deputy clerk during such term. The clerk shall file this order in his office. Such deputy clerk shall receive such compensation as the judge shall determine, not exceeding \$10.00 per day, while attending such term of court.

CHAPTER 371—S. F. No. 297

An act relating to temporary employment in the classified service of the state of Minnesota; repealing Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 43.11.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 43.11, is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 372-S. F. No. 680

An act relating to bounties and increasing the bounty on rattlesnakes; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 348.12.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 348.12, is amended to read:

348.12 Certain birds and animals; bounties, counties, towns. Any county board or board of town supervisors may, by resolution, offer a bounty for the destruction of gophers, ground squirrels, ground hogs, or woodchucks, rattlesnakes, crows, or blackbirds. The resolution may be made to cover the whole or any part of the county, and may be annually renewed, but it shall have force and effect only during the calendar year in which it was adopted or renewed. The bounty shall in no case exceed five cents for each pocket gopher; three cents for each common gopher or ground squirrel; 15 cents for each ground hog or woodchuck; \$1.00 for each rattlesnake, and ten cents a dozen for blackbirds, and ten cents for each crow killed during such months, as may be designated by the county board or board of town supervisors by resolution.

CHAPTER 373—S. F. No. 766 [Not Coded]

An act correcting the description of certain counties and relating to the salaries of county commissioners; amending Laws 1949. Chapter 610, Section 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1949, Chapter 610, Section 1, is amended to read:

Section 1. County board, salaries. In each county of this state, now or hereafter having a population of not less than 39,500 and not more than 50,000, and having an [a] taxable valuation of not less than \$19,000,000 and not more than \$25,000,000 and containing within its boundaries a city of the third class, adjacent to a city of the first class in an ad-
