CHAPTER 527—S. F. No. 439

An act to provide one additional judge of the municipal court of the city of Minneapolis.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minneapolis Municipal Court; additional judge. There shall be elected in the City of Minneapolis six municipal judges, one of whom shall be a conciliation judge, any one or all of whom may perform the duties and exercise the powers of the court as prescribed by law. Each of the present judges of the municipal court of the City of Minneapolis, including the conciliation judge, shall continue as judges thereof for the term for which they were elected.

Sec. 2. Appointment, election. Upon the effective date of this act the governor shall appoint a competent person, learned in the law, as such additional municipal judge, who shall qualify and enter upon his duties as such at any time on or after the effective date of this act. He shall hold office and exercise the powers of a judge of such court until his successor is elected and qualifies. The salary of such additional judge shall be the same and shall be paid in the same manner as that of the present judges of such municipal court. A successor to said appointee shall be elected at the first general election occurring after the effective date of this act.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect September 1, 1951.
