

## CHAPTER 52—S. F. No. 70

[Not Coded]

*An act to provide an additional judge for the district court of the Ninth Judicial District of the state, and relating to his rights, duties and powers; amending Laws 1923, Chapter 199, Section 3.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1923, Chapter 199, Section 3, is amended to read:

**Sec. 3. Duties, rights, powers.** The incumbent of the office hereby created shall have and exercise all the rights, powers and privileges and shall be subject to the same duties and obligations as are by law granted to and imposed upon the other judge of said court.

He shall receive the same compensation as such other judge and shall be paid in the same manner and at the same time as the other judge of said court.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1951.

CHAPTER 53—S. F. No. 121

*An act relating to the general terms of the district court in the First Judicial District; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 484.09.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 484.09, is amended to read:

**484.09. First Judicial District.** General terms of District Court in the counties constituting the First Judicial Dis-

trict shall be held each year at the times herein specified:

Dakota County: The fourth Monday in January, the first Monday in May, and the second Monday in November.

Goodhue County: The second Monday in *February*, the second Monday in *May*, and the first Monday in October.

#### CHAPTER 54—S. F. No. 132

*An act relating to the salary of deputy register of deeds in certain counties; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 386.34.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 386.34, is amended to read:

386.34. **Salaries of deputies.** Subdivision 1. The county board of each county having a population of less than 75,000, may by written order to be filed in the office of the county auditor allow one deputy register of deeds in such county compensation for services as such deputy, to be fixed by the board and specified in said order. In each county containing less than 15 full and fractional congressional townships, and having more than 16,000 and less than 19,000 inhabitants according to the 1940 federal census, and having an assessed valuation of less than \$7,000,000, exclusive of moneys and credits, the county board may by written order to be filed in the office of the county auditor allow one deputy register of deeds in such county compensation for services as such deputy not exceeding \$1,500 per year.

Subd. 2. This act shall be in effect beginning January 1, 1951.
