tries, providing indemnity among themselves for any loss which may be insured against under other provisions of the laws, excepting life and *ocean* marine insurance; provided, that public corporations may so exchange reciprocal or interinsurance contracts only when the issuing exchange has a surplus of \$300,000 or more and said contracts are issued without contingent liability.

These contracts may be executed by an attorney, agent, or other representative, herein designated attorney, duly authorized and acting for such subscribers.

CHAPTER 171-H. F. No. 823

An act relating to powers of the commissioner of conservation; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 97.48, Subdivision 15.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 97.48, Subdivision 15, is amended to read:

The commissioner shall acquire by gift, lease, purchase, or condemnation in the manner prescribed by section 117.20, in the name of the state, and to maintain from the game and fish fund, parking or camping areas of not to exceed five acres, adjacent to public waters to which the public theretofore had no access or where the access is inadequate and upon which the public has a right to hunt and fish, and such easements and rights of way as may be required to connect such areas with public highways, provided, no acquisition costing over \$1,000 shall be made without first obtaining the approval of the executive council, and provided further that the authority herein granted shall not extend to lakes completely surrounded by lands owned and maintained for the purpose of conducting an educational or religious institution, or to lakes which are unmeandered or which contain less than 200 acres within the meander lines; provided, that in the case of any lake containing less than 200 acres but not less than 150 acres within the meander lines, the authority herein granted shall apply where the lands, easements, or rights of way reguired are acquired by gift or purchase but not by condemnation.
