CHAPTER 356-H. F. No. 1331

An act relating to intoxicating liquors; amending Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 340.11, Subdivision 15.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 340.11, Subdivision 15, is amended to read:

Subd. 15. No license for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall be issued by any newly incorporated village, nor shall such village operate a municipal store or bar, until the expiration of two years from the date of incorporation.

CHAPTER 357-S. F. No. 153

[Not Coded]

An act relating to tax levies for revenue purposes in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Tax levy, Anoka county. In any county in this state now or hereafter having a population of not less than 35,000, nor more than 40,000 inhabitants, according to the 1950 federal census and containing more than 15 and les sthan 20 full and fractional congressional townships and containing a total acreage of not less than 270,000, nor more than 280,000 acres, the board of county commissioners may levy taxes annually for general revenue purposes at such rate and in such an amount in excess of existing limitations as will produce sufficient revenue to defray the county expenses payable out of the revenue fund; providing the annual tax levy shall not exceed \$200,000. Any tax levy heretofore made for revenue purposes by any county falling within the provisions of this act is hereby legalized and made valid.
