Sec. 4. [20.34] **Application.** This act shall not apply to a farmer operating his own equipment on his own property, or for hire within 15 miles of his farm residence, but no person shall operate any such equipment within the corporate limits of any municipality without the consent of the governing body thereof.

Sec. 5. [20.35] **Violation, misdemeanor.** A person who violates section 2 of this act is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 6. The permit requirements of this act become effective July 1, 1953.

CHAPTER 710—S. F. No. 1293

[Coded]

An act relating to the candling of eggs, and amending Laws 1949, Chapter 211, Section 6.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1949, Chapter 211, Section 6, is amended to read:

Sec. 6. [29.095]. **Candling.** *The first licensed buyer shall cause all eggs to be candled, irrespective of time or season, and all adulterated and inedible eggs removed before purchase. Such candling shall be done before payment in full is made, but nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent a licensed buyer from advancing or making a partial payment to the producer before such candling.*
