

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 212.35, is amended to read:

212.35 Date; officers elected, terms. Subdivision 1. The regular village election shall be held annually on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of December in each year, *or on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November if the governing body of such village so determines at a regular meeting held at least 60 days prior to said election.*

Subd. 2. The mayor, one constable, one trustee, and, if elective, the treasurer, shall be elected in each odd-numbered year. One constable, one trustee, and, if elective, the assessor and clerk shall be elected in each even-numbered year; and an additional trustee shall be elected every third year in every village operating under an optional plan of government. Terms of present incumbents not conforming to this schedule shall be extended for one year.

Subd. 3. The existing succession of terms of municipal judges and justices of the peace shall be continued, and their successors shall be elected at the village election preceding the expiration of their respective terms.

CHAPTER 254—H. F. No. 169

An act relating to game and fish; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 101.411.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 101.411, is amended to read:

101.411 Rough fish; spearing or archery, limitations. Any resident person permitted by law to take fish by angling may take rough fish by spearing *or archery* during such seasons at such times and in such waters subject to such limits and other conditions as the commissioner of conservation by regulation may prescribe; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall restrict the power of the commissioner of conservation to close any waters for winter spearing *or archery*.
