in the home or in a hospital or sanatorium for handicapped children shall not exceed the amount expended for such class or instruction during the year for which the aid is paid.

The board of education receiving such aid shall render annually to the state commissioner of education an itemized statement of all expenditures of said school or schools, and such related facts as he may require.

## CHAPTER 822—H. F. No. 1229 [Not Coded]

An act relating to the nomination and election of the judges of the municipal court in cities of the first class now or hereafter having a population of not less than 300,000 inhabitants nor more than 500,000 inhabitants.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. St. Paul municipal court, election of judges. In any municipal court of this state in any city of the first class now or hereafter having a population of not less than 300,000 inhabitants nor more than 500,000 inhabitants, when two or more judges of said municipal court are to be nominated at a primary city election or elected at a general city election, the notice of election shall state the name of each judge whose successor is to be nominated or elected. Each judge of said municipal court holds a separate non-partisan office. The official ballot shall contain the names of all candidates for each such office, shall state the number of judges to be elected and the number of candidates for whom an elector may vote, and shall designate each candidacy as "For the office of Judge of the Municipal Court of

The ballots for both the primary and general city elections shall show in the spaces for the purpose the name of the municipality and the name of the judge whose successor is to be elected at the general city election. If any judge of such court is a candidate to succeed him-

self, the word "incumbent" shall be printed after his name where it appears among the names of the candidates for the office. If voting machines are used and the statements above cannot be inserted because of length, the designation shall be "Successor to \_\_\_\_\_\_ (elected)", or "Succes-

\_\_\_ (appointed)", as the case may be. Name of Judge

- Candidates. Any eligible person desirous of having his name placed upon the primary ballot as a candidate for judge of such municipal court affected hereby shall also state in his affidavit of candidacy the office of the particular judge for which he is a candidate. The filing of this affidavit of candidacy with the city clerk of such municipality and a compliance with all other requirements constitutes such person a candidate for that office and for that office only.
- Sec. 3. Provisions additional. The provisions of this bill shall be in addition to the provisions of any other act affecting the judges of such municipal courts affected hereby and the election thereof...

## CHAPTER 823—H. F. No. 1249 [Not Coded]

An act relating to county aid for schools in certain counties and authorizing tax levies therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- St. Louis county, special county aid to school districts for buildings. All counties having a population of over 200,000 and less than 300,000 and containing an area in excess of 5000 square miles shall pay special county aid to qualified school districts for building purposes.
- Qualifications required of school districts. School districts entitled to receive building aid under provisions of this act shall have the following qualifications:
- the total assessed valuation of all taxable real property in the district shall be less than \$1,800 per resident pupli unit in average daily attendance.
- the supervisor of assessments shall certify to the county board that the assessed values within the school dis-
