Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1953, Chapter 499, as amended by Laws 1955, Chapter 66, is amended to read:

Ramsey county; sheriff, employees. Section 1. The sheriff in any county having more than 350,000 and less than 500,000 inhabitants shall appoint and employ one chief deputy, one chief criminal deputy and three assistants, ten court bailiffs, one chief patrol deputy and fourteen assistants, one female deputy, four process servers, one chief jailer and eleven assistants, one matron and four assistants, one bookkeeper-cashier, one principal clerk, two clerk-stenographers and one senior clerk-typist. If a two-way radio broadcasting system is established for use of the sheriff, the board of county commissioners may authorize the employment of not to exceed five additional employees. Said chief patrol deputy shall be allowed \$75.00 per month for the operation of his automobile. The titles herein mentioned shall not be controlling but shall be subject to change by the county board or other lawful authority.

## CHAPTER 110-H. F. No. 370

An act relative to the assignment clerk in the office of the clerk of the district court in counties having more than 240,000 and less than 330,000 inhabitants; and repealing Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 485.04.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Repealer.** Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 485.04, is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 111-H. F. No. 372

An act relating to owning and operating of radio broadcasting stations by counties having more than 350,000 and less than 500,000 inhabitants for police, fire, highway and other purposes and authorizing the use of such facilities by

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towns and municipalities within such counties and by adjoining counties and towns and municipalities therein.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Ramsey county, police broadcasting system. Any county having more than 350,000 and less than 500,000 inhabitants may rent or lease or may construct, equip and maintain a radio broadcasting system for two-way communication for police, fire, highway, ambulance, coroner, or other purposes, to be operated under the direction of the sheriff. It may acquire land by purchase or condemnation for use as a site therefor.

Sec. 2. Use of county broadcasting system. Any such county may allow the use of such facilities by any town, village or city located within the county, and by any adjoining county and any town, village or city therein upon application of the governing body thereof to the county board requesting such communication service on a cost sharing basis. All mobile radio equipment and apparatus used in connection with such extended service may be owned, maintained and serviced by the county owning the broadcasting station.

Sec. 3. Monies paid into general revenue fund. All monies received for the services rendered shall be paid into the general revenue fund of the county.

## CHAPTER 112-H. F. No. 408

An act relating to certain school districts having more than 5,000 and less than 10,000 inhabitants and operating schools in more than four villages or cities, authorizing bonds for the construction, acquisition and betterment of school buildings and the levy of taxes for the payment of such bonds.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Certain school districts; bonds, tax levies. Any school district having more than 5,000 and less than 10,000 inhabitants and operating schools in more than four villages or cities, may issue and sell bonds, in addition to any bonds heretofore issued, in a principal amount not exceeding \$1,000,000 for the purpose of construction, acquisition and betterment of school buildings and additions.
