

CHAPTER 196—H. F. No. 186

An act changing the name of the state asylum for the dangerous insane to Minnesota Security Hospital.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [253.201] **Minnesota Security Hospital.** The state asylum for the dangerous insane at St. Peter established by Laws 1907, Chapter 338 shall hereafter be known as the Minnesota Security Hospital and shall continue under the management of the superintendent of the St. Peter State Hospital, and the revisor of statutes shall substitute the latter name wherever the term "asylum for the dangerous insane" or "hospital for the dangerous insane" now appears in the statutes.

CHAPTER 197—H. F. No. 334

An act relating to judges and clerks of elections in cities of the first class having a population of not less than 300,000 nor more than 450,000 inhabitants.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **St. Paul, election judges and clerks.** In any city of the first class having a population of not less than 300,000 nor more than 450,000 inhabitants, judges and clerks of election shall be appointed by the city clerk at least 25 days before an election from a list of qualified voters in each district certified by the civil service commission of the municipality. At least 60 days before an election said civil service commissioner shall receive applications on verified forms prepared by it from persons qualified to act as such judges and clerks, in which application said applicant shall state his party affiliation, and said commission shall conduct such inquiry, investigation and examination as it deems necessary to establish the qualifications of the applicants. The commission shall set up such rules and regulations as it deems necessary for carrying out the provisions of this act. At least 30 days before the first election in any calendar year wherein elections are held such civil service commission shall certify to the city clerk a list of such persons in each district who have satisfied
