An act granting county boards the authority to license and regulate the business of certain vendors at retail of soft drinks and other non-alcoholic beverages; and providing a penalty for the violation of such regulations; amending Laws 1955, Chapter 810.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1955, Chapter 810 is amended to read:

Section 1. [375.193] Retail vendors of soft drinks, licenses. There is hereby conferred upon each county board the authority, by resolution or ordinance, to license or regulate the business of vendors at retail of soft drinks and other non-alcoholic beverages located outside the limits of any municipality. The board may impose a reasonable license fee therefor and suspend or revoke such license for any violation of such ordinance or resolution or of Minnesota Statutes 1953, Chapter 340. Any person violating the terms of any resolution or ordinance adopted pursuant to this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or imprisoned in the county jail for not more than 90 days.

An act authorizing the transfer of all state lands acquired and dedicated for the Alexander Ramsey State Park, as provided in Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 85.10, to the City of Redwood Falls in Redwood County, Minnesota, to be used for a public park and for recreational and other cultural civic purposes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [85.103] Transfer of lands to Redwood Falls for public park [Subdivision 1.] Whereas Alexander Ramsey State Park was established as provided in Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 85.10, and comprises certain lands in areas hereinafter described and has become enveloped in the rapidly expanding municipal development of the City of Redwood Falls, and whereas, the City of Redwood Falls has need
