## CHAPTER 288-S. F. No. 1080

An act relating to salaries of mayor and councilmen in certain cities.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Cities fourth class, mayor, councilmen; salaries. In any city of the fourth class having an assessed valuation in excess of \$95,000 and a population of more than 750 and less than 1,000 inhabitants according to the last federal census and which is located in a county having a land area in excess of 5,000 square miles; the salary of the mayor shall be determined by the council at a sum not to exceed \$30 per meeting or \$400 per year and the salary of each councilman shall be determined by the council at a sum of not to exceed \$10 per meeting or \$150 per year. The council is authorized to establish the salaries of the mayor and councilmen within these salary limitations irrespective of city charter provisions to the contrary, and may make changes effective at such times as it may determine.

## CHAPTER 289—S. F. No. 1102

An act relating to public corporations created in connection therewith under and pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1953, Sections 360.101 to 360.133, authorizing the metropolitan airports commission to insure commissioners, officers, and employees against liability arising out of their conduct, including operation of motor vehicles in the performance of their duties; and amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 360.106.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 360.106, is amended by adding thereto a subdivision to read:

[Subd. 6.] The corporation may indemnify any commissioner, officer, or employee for loss or expense arising or resulting from any claim made against him because of bodily injury, death or property damage sustained by reason of his performance of his official duties for the corporation, including bodily injury, death or property damage sustained by
