CHAPTER 387-S. F. No. 861

An act relating to the sale of intoxicating liquors; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 340.11, Subdivision 7.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 340.11, Subdivision 7, is amended to read:

Not more than ten "on sale" licenses shall be issued in any city of the third class. Not more than five "on sale" licenses shall be issued in any city of the fourth class, or borough. Not more than ten "on sale" licenses shall be issued in any village of over 10,000 population. Not more than five "on sale" licenses shall be issued in any village of 5,000 to 10,000 population. Not more than four "on sale" licenses shall be issued in any village of 2,500 to 5,000 population. Not more than three "on sale" licenses shall be issued in any village of 500 to 2,500 population. Not more than two "on sale" licenses shall be issued in any village of less than 500 population. In cities of the fourth class containing a population of more than 5,000 situated in counties containing not less than 20,000, nor more than 25,000 inhabitants according to the 1930 federal census, and containing not less than 20, nor more than 21, full and fractional congressional townships, ten "on sale" licenses may be issued. In any city of the fourth class operating under a home rule charter, having a population exceeding 4,000, and not more than 4,500, according to the 1940 federal census, located in a county containing not less than 12, nor more than 13, townships, there may be issued in addition to the five "on sale" licenses herein provided for, only one "on sale" license to an hotel which operates a dining room serving meals regularly and which contains not less than 40 sleeping rooms. In any city having a population of more than 18,000 and less than 19,000, located in a county having more than 38,000 and less than 39,000 inhabitants according to the 1950 federal census, and not less than 23 full or fractional congressional townships, the governing body of the city may issue, in addition to the ten "on sale" liquor licenses herein provided, one "on sale" liquor license to a hotel, which contains not less than 150 guest rooms and operates a dining room serving meals regularly.
