

*person who on July 1, 1957 has ten or more years of allowable service as a member and whose deductions from salary continues at the rate in effect under this act shall have the option when he retires to receive the retirement benefits computed under Minnesota Statutes 1953, Chapter 353, as amended by Laws 1955, Chapter 815, or the benefits computed under this act.*

*Subd. 2. Any person who ceased to be a public employee prior to July 1, 1957 and who left his accumulated deductions in the fund for the purpose of receiving, when eligible, a retirement annuity or allowance in accordance with the law in effect at the date public service terminated, shall have his annuity or retirement allowance computed in accordance with the law in effect on the date he ceased to be a public employee.*

*Subd. 3. Any survivor benefits selected by a member prior to July 1, 1957 pursuant to Laws 1955, Chapter 815, Section 10, shall continue in effect until the member retires. Such survivor shall have the option of receiving the payments provided under such election or the survivor benefits provided in this act.*

*An act prescribing the salaries of elected and appointed officers and employees in the unclassified service in the executive branch of the state government, repealing Minnesota Statutes 1953, Sections 15.21, 15.22 and 15.23.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Section 1. [350.16] Unclassified service in executive branch.** The following annual salaries are established for the elected and appointed officers and employees in the un-

classified service in the executive branch of the state government except as otherwise provided for herein:

Except for the amount of annual salary the superintendent, Gillette State Hospital shall be subject to the other terms and conditions of Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 246.02 as amended by Laws 1955, Chapter 746.

Sec. 10. [350.25] **Other officers and employees in unclassified service.** The salaries of all other officers and employees in the unclassified service in the executive branch of the state government whose salaries are not specifically fixed by this act or any other provision of law shall be adjusted to the class of persons in the classified service, performing comparable work and having comparable responsibility, as determined by the director of civil service, but in no event in an amount in excess of the maximum of such class.

Sec. 11. [350.26] **Governor may fix certain salaries.** The salary of a department head and any deputy of a department head occupying a position in the unclassified service hereafter established whose salary is not specifically prescribed by law shall be fixed by the governor in an amount comparable to the salary of a department head or a deputy of a department head having similar duties and having responsibilities as prescribed by this act.

Sec. 12. [350.27] **Other terms and conditions of employment.** The annual salaries prescribed by this act for the persons holding positions in the unclassified service of the executive branch of the state government are in addition to other terms and conditions of their employment as now or hereafter prescribed by law.

Sec. 13. [350.28] **Application.** This act does not apply to personnel of the state highway patrol or to any other person holding a position the salary of which is specifically set by law and not covered by this act.

Sec. 14. [350.29] **Construction.** Nothing in this act shall be construed to in any way affect the number of positions as now provided by law and designated in this act in the singular nor the appropriations from which the salaries herein prescribed are payable.

Sec. 15. **Inconsistent acts.** All acts or parts of acts now in effect relating to the annual salary of persons holding positions in the unclassified service in the executive branch of the state government inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed, superseded, modified or amended so far as necessary to give full force and effect to the provisions of this act.

Sec. 16. This act is in effect on and after July 1, 1957.

CHAPTER 937—H. F. No. 1451

*An act relating to the payment of state aids to schools; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Sections 128.082 Subdivision 6, as amended, 128.066, 128.084; repealing Minnesota Statutes 1953, Sections 128.081 Subdivision 3, as amended, 128.081 Subdivision 6, 128.082 Subdivision 1, as amended, 128.082 Subdivisions 2, 3, 4, 9.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. [128.091] **Foundation program aid.** (a) Foundation program aid shall be special state aid for schools as computed under the terms of section 2 of this act.

(b) Current adjusted assessed valuation for the purposes of this act shall mean the adjusted assessed valuation as determined by the equalization aid review committee under the provisions of section 4, provided, that for the 1957-1958 school year it shall mean the correct assessed valuation approved by the equalization aid review committee and filed with the commissioner of education in the calendar year 1956 and for the 1958-1959 and 1959-1960 school years it shall mean the correct assessed valuation approved by the equalization aid review committee and filed with the commissioner of education in the calendar year 1957.

Sec. 2. [128.092] **Maximum amount of foundation program aid.** Subdivision 1. The maximum amount of foundation program aid, including the amounts payable under both Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 128.02 and Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 290.62, which a school district or unorganized territory may receive shall equal (a) or (b) as calculated under the provisions of this subdivision, whichever is greater, less the maximum foundation program aid payable
