purchased after June 30, 1949, in addition to the face tax value of the stamps so purchased, a sum equal to ten percent of the face tax value of the stamps so purchased. On and after July 1, 1949, all stamps sold by the state treasurer shall have a tax value which is ten percent greater than their face tax value. This subdivision shall be effective as of July 1, 1949, and shall expire on June 30, 1959, except as to the collection of taxes theretofore levied thereunder and unpaid. The increases in the several rates of taxation levied by this subdivision on the sale, either directly or indirectly, of fermented malt beverages other than for shipment in interstate or foreign commerce shall hereafter be known as the surtax on fermented malt beverages. The proceeds of the surtax imposed by this subdivision are pledged to the payment of the bonds authorized by Laws 1949, Chapter 642, and the surtax shall not be reduced below ten percent of the respective rates as they are now fixed by law on the sale, either directly or indirectly, of fermented malt beverages other than for shipment in interstate or foreign commerce. Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision 2, the proceeds of the surtax imposed by this subdivision shall be deposited in the state treasury to the credit of the veterans compensation fund.

The Regents of the University of Minnesota are hereby designated the state agency empowered to accept any and all moneys provided for or made available to this state by the United States of America or any department or agency thereof for the construction and equipping of any building for University or college purposes in accordance with the provisions of federal law and any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder and are further authorized to do any and all things required of this state by such federal law and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder in order to obtain such federal moneys.

- Sec. 7. Lands or sites for public buildings, the acquisition of which is included in the appropriations made by this act, may be acquired by gift, purchase or condemnation proceedings by the Regents of the University in case of lands for the University and by the Commissioner of Administration in the case of other lands. If any of such lands are acquired by condemnation proceedings, such proceeding shall be undertaken pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1953, Chapter 117, and any acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto.
- Sec. 8. Subdivision 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, upon the final completion of any project enumerated in Section 2, subdivisions 2 through 27, the Commissioner of Administration may transfer any unexpended funds in said project account to any other project therein enumerated, if additional funds are needed therefor.
- Subd. 2. Except as otherwise provided in this section, upon the final completion of any project enumerated in Section 2, subdivisions 28 through 32, the Commissioner of Administration may transfer any unexpended funds in said project account to any other project therein enumerated, if additional funds are needed therefor.
- Subd. 3. Except as otherwise provided in this section, upon the final completion of any project enumerated in Section 2, subdivision 33, the Commissioner of Administration may transfer any unexpended funds in said project account to any other project therein enumerated.
- Subd. 4. No moneys may be transferred either to or from any project for land acquisition.
- Subd. 5. The Commissioner of Administration shall report to the Legislative Buildings Commission from time to time relating to transfers of money made under this section.

- Sec. 9. Subdivision 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, upon the final completion of any project enumerated in Section 4, the Commissioner of Conservation may transfer any unexpended funds in such project account to any other project therein enumerated, if additional funds are needed therefor. No moneys may be transferred either to or from any project for land acquisition.
- Subd. 2. The Commissioner of Conservation shall report to the Legislative Buildings Commission from time to time of any transfers of money made under this section.
- Sec. 10. Subdivision 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, upon the final completion of any project enumerated in Section 5, the Adjutant General may transfer any unexpended funds in such project account to any other project therein enumerated, if additional funds are needed therefor. No moneys may be transferred either to or from any project for land acquisition.
- Subd. 2. The Adjutant General shall report to the Legislative Buildings Commission from time to time of any transfers of money made under this section.
- Sec. 11. Subdivision 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, upon the final completion of any project enumerated in Section 6, the Regents of the University of Minnesota may transfer any unexpended funds in such project account to any other project therein enumerated, if additional funds are needed therefor. No moneys may be transferred either to or from any project for land acquisition.
- Subd. 2. The Regents of the University of Minnesota shall report to the Legislative Buildings Commission from time to time of any transfers of money made under this section.
- Sec. 12. Such sums of money as may be necessary to make the transfers provided for in Sections 8 through 11 are hereby appropriated for such purposes.
- Sec. 13. There is hereby appropriated to the Commissioner of Administration, not to exceed \$50,000, which may be expended by him for the administration of the building program covered by his appropriation, including the employment of personnel. Any person so employed shall be in the unclassified service.
- Sec. 14. Subdivision 1. For the purpose of providing funds appropriated by this act from the Minnesota State Building Fund, there is hereby levied upon all the taxable property in this state, including notwithstanding the provi-

sions of Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 273.13, Subdivisions 6 and 7, as amended, all real property used for the purposes of a homestead, a tax sufficient to produce \$55,121,939, which the state auditor shall cause to be extended and collected in the manner in which other state taxes upon real and personal property are extended and collected, to be included in the levies spread upon the tax rolls for the years 1957-1976, inclusive, in amounts sufficient to produce the sum of \$2,756,097 in each of the years 1958 to 1977, inclusive, plus additional amounts sufficient to produce such sums as may be necessary to pay the interest upon certificates of indebtedness issued pursuant to the provisions of this act. The proceeds of such tax levies and of the sale of certificates of indebtedness issued hereunder shall be credited to the Minnesota state building fund. In case of a deficiency of such tax levy for any year, the auditor shall levy sufficient additional amounts in succeeding years to compensate therefor until the full amount herein authorized has been raised. The moneys in the Minnesota State Building fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes herein specified.

The state auditor shall, in anticipation of the Subd. 2. collection of taxes levied in subdivision 1 hereof, issue and sell certificates of indebtedness in the amount and subject to the limitations herein prescribed. Such certificates shall be known as state building certificates of 1957-1976, and shall be issued upon the certification of the Commissioner of Administration that funds are needed for the purposes authorized herein, not exceeding \$55,121,939 in the aggregate. Such certificates shall be numbered consecutively and shall be issued and sold at not less than par upon sealed bids after two weeks' published notice, unless sold to the state board of investment, which may invest any funds under its control or direction in any such certificates of indebtedness so issued and to purchase such certificates, notwithstanding any limitations imposed by Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 11.10 or any other law inconsistent herewith, at such rate of interest as it may determine. Such certificates shall be in such sum and of such denomination and shall mature at such times as the state auditor shall determine, not exceeding the time when funds shall be available for the payment thereof from the tax levies herein authorized. Such certificates shall bear such rate of interest, payable semi-annually, and shall contain such other terms and provisions not inconsistent herewith, as the state auditor may require. Such certificates shall be signed by the state treasurer and attested by the state auditor under their official seals and the state auditor and the state treasurer shall keep records thereof. Such certificates shall be a charge against the taxes herein authorized. The principal and interest of such certifi-

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cates shall be payable from the proceeds of such taxes, and so much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated for such payments, provided that such interest as may become due at any time when there is not on hand a sufficient amount from the proceeds of such taxes to pay the same, shall be paid out of the general revenue fund in the state treasury, and the amount necessary therefor is hereby appropriated, to be reimbursed from the proceeds of such taxes when received.

- Subd. 3. Any expenses incidental to the printing and sale of certificates of indebtedness, including actual and necessary travel and subsistence expenses of state officers and employees for such purposes, shall be paid from the Minnesota state building fund and the amounts therefor are hereby appropriated from such fund.
- Sec. 15. Where lands are acquired under this act and converted into parking facilities, the appropriation made includes expenses for demolition of existing structures thereon and preparing the land for parking uses.
- Sec. 16. At any state institution or any state park or in the maintenance of any state armory, appropriations for construction, improvements, or maintenance may be expended through the use of inmate or project labor when authorized by the Commissioner of Administration with the concurrence of the head of the interested state department for the fiscal year 1958 and thereafter.
- Sec. 17. Any moneys in the Mayo Memorial Building Fund arising from an excess of taxes levied and collected pursuant to Laws 1949, Chapter 625, for the retirement of Mayo Memorial Building Fund Certificates of 1949 and interest thereon are available for the payment of outstanding Mayo Memorial Building Fund Certificates of 1949 and interest thereon and so much thereof as may be necessary is appropriated for such payments.

If on November 1, 1958, there are sufficient funds in the Memorial Building Fund arising from the deposit therein of such excess tax collections, the tax levy for that taxable year as provided by Laws 1949, Chapter 625, shall be cancelled and shall not be made; otherwise, the amount to be raised by the tax levy for that taxable year shall be reduced by the amount in the Mayo Memorial Building Fund arising from the deposit therein of such excess tax collections. The State Auditor and the State Treasurer shall make the appropriate entries in their accounts.

Sec. 18. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the

contrary, all the moneys appropriated herein shall be deemed for construction or other permanent improvement and shall be available until the purposes for which such appropriation was made shall have been accomplished or abandoned.

Sec. 19. This act is in effect from and after its passage. Approved May 2, 1957.

EXTRA SESSION

CHAPTER 3—H. F. No. 3 [Not Coded]

An act relating to the administration of state government including expenses of the legislature, appropriating moneys for education and related purposes, including aids to rural libraries, junior colleges, and hog experimentation, and other state governmental purposes, and limiting and regulating the use thereof; providing aid to school districts affected by gross earnings taxation and for the payment of agricultural agents; authorizing the power of eminent domain with certain of the funds provided hereby; and authorizing salary adjustments of certain state officers and employees.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES, APPROPRIATIONS. Except as herein otherwise provided, the sums hereinafter set forth in the columns designated "APPROPRIATIONS," or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of the general revenue fund in the state treasury for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act, to be available for the fiscal years indicated for each purpose. The figure "1957," "1958," and "1959" wherever used in this act, shall mean that the appropriation or appropriations listed thereunder shall be available for the year ending June 30, 1957, 1958 and 1959, respectively.

Sec. 2. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION:
