

EXTRA SESSION
CHAPTER 7—H. F. No. 10

An act relating to the salary and fees of probate and juvenile court judges in certain counties and repealing all acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Probate and juvenile court judges, certain counties; salaries. In all counties of this state, except counties containing a city of the first class, the annual salary of probate and juvenile court judges, shall be paid in 12 equal monthly installments as follows:

In counties having a population of less than 5,000, the sum of \$4,500.

In counties having a population of 5,000 and less than 10,000, the sum of \$5,000.

In counties having a population of 10,000 and less than 15,000, the sum of \$5,500.

In counties having a population of 15,000 and less than 20,000, the sum \$6,250.

In counties having a population of 20,000 and less than 25,000, the sum of \$7,000.

In counties having a population of 25,000 and less than 30,000, the sum of \$7,500.

In counties having a population of 30,000 and less than 35,000, the sum of \$8,000.

In counties having a population of 35,000 and less than 50,000, the sum of \$9,500.

Sec. 2. Specific compensation. The salary herein provided shall be in full compensation for all services rendered by him, other than that of performing marriages, and in lieu of all fees and emoluments provided by law for official services, except compensation for services as a member of the Youth Conservation Commission.

All fees collectible by and paid to the probate court, except as herein provided, shall be turned over to the general revenue fund of the county.

Sec. 3. Census figures. Population figures herein used shall refer to the 1950 U. S. census, unless the county board of

commissioners shall have, for the purpose of this act, adopted a resolution embodying a different population figure as certified to it by any state agency.

Sec. 4. Legislative intent. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the legislature that the probate judges of all counties falling within the purview of section 1 are to be paid compensation for their office solely as provided herein and for that express purpose all statutes, special or general laws or acts, or portions thereof, heretofore or hereafter passed before or during the 1957 Legislative Session are hereby expressly repealed.

Sec. 5. Additional compensation, certain counties. In any county in which the taxable valuation of the property is less than three million dollars the salary shall be \$4,500 unless in any such county the combined salary of a probate judge and the juvenile judge is now in excess of \$4,500, in which event the salary shall be the present combined salary of the probate judge and juvenile judge plus \$600.

Sec. 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 1957 and shall expire July 1, 1959.

CHAPTER 8—H. F. No. 11

An act creating a commission to investigate and study agricultural problems and legal and economic problems relating to agriculture and appropriating money therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Interim commission, agricultural problems. A commission is hereby created to consist of five members of the senate, to be appointed by the committee on committees, and five members of the house of representatives, to be appointed by the speaker. The appointment of such commission shall be made upon passage of this act. Any vacancy that may occur in the membership of the commission shall be filled by the appointing power.

Sec. 2. Duties. The commission shall continue the work of the agricultural laws study commission created by 1955 House Concurrent Resolution No. 9 with regard to an
