

Sec. 6. Nashwauk, village of, police pension. For the support of the fund from which such pensions are paid the council or other governing body of the village shall each year, at the time the tax levies are made for the general revenues of the village, levy within the limits then permitted by law, a tax on all taxable property of the village in the amount of \$2,500 per annum, which levy shall be transmitted to the auditor of the county in which the village is located at the time the other tax levies are transmitted and shall be collected and the payment enforced in the same manner as other taxes of the village. In addition thereto each member of the association shall contribute to the fund each month five percent of his monthly pay, to be deducted at the time of the payment of his salary or wages by the village and transferred to the fund, in addition thereto, such relief association may transfer to such fund moneys raised from other sources and under the control of the association.

Sec. 3. Laws 1943, Chapter 196, Section 7, as amended by Laws 1955, Chapter 88, Section 3, is amended to read:

Sec. 7. If at any time the balance on hand in the fund, together with interest or other earnings accrued therein, exceeds the sum of \$30,000, then, as often as this occurs the levy of taxes for the fund shall be omitted for that year, and if at any time the whole amount of \$2,500 from taxation is not needed for the maintenance of the fund at \$30,000, then the sum to be raised by taxation shall be proportionately reduced to such amount as is sufficient to keep the fund at \$30,000.

Sec. 4. *This act shall be effective upon its approval by a majority of the members of the village council of the village of Nashwauk.*

CHAPTER 359—S. F. No. 1377

An act relating to an assessment for fire identification numbers in the Township of Forest Lake in Washington County.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Assessment for fire identification numbers.

The town board of Forest Lake township in Washington county may authorize the town supervisors to levy an assessment of up to \$6 on each owner of real estate for fire identification numbers.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect only after its approval by a majority vote of the town board of Forest Lake township in Washington county.

CHAPTER 360—S. F. No. 1524

An act establishing the Lac Qui Parle State Recreation Reserve.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [85.193] **Lac Qui Parle State Recreation Reserve.** [Subdivision 1.] The following described lands are hereby dedicated and set aside as the Lac Qui Parle State Recreation Reserve for the perpetual use of the people of the State of Minnesota, to-wit:

All lands situated in Sections 13, 14, 15, 23, and 24, Township 118 North, Range 42 West of the 5th Principal Meridian, lying between the southwesterly meander line of Lac Qui Parle Lake; westerly meander line of the main channel of the Minnesota River; and the existing northerly, easterly and westerly right of way line of the County road, said right of way line being 100' distant at right angles northerly, easterly and westerly of the following described roadway center line.

Commencing at a point in the south line of Section 13, Township 118 North, Range 42 West, 2852 feet west of the southeast corner of said Section 13; said point being the east face of the west abutment of the Minnesota River Control Dam and bridge; thence west along the south line of said Section 13, a distance of 357.3 feet to a point of curve; thence on a 3°00' curve to the left a distance of 1290 feet; thence on a tangent to last described curve, a distance of 2594.7 feet; said line passing through the east line
