Sec. 4. This Act shall become effective only after its approval by a majority vote of the City Council of the City of Saint Paul, Ramsey County.

## CHAPTER 554—H. F. No. 1440

## [Coded]

An act relating to motor vehicles; providing for the Commissioner of Highways to determine colors and markings for certain motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. [169.98] Police or patrol vehicles, markings and colors. All motor vehicles which are primarily used in the enforcement of highway traffic regulations by any police department, highway patrol, or peace officer shall have uniform colors and markings as provided herein. The commissioner of highways by rule or regulation shall establish uniform colors and markings for such motor vehicles which colors and markings shall be both distinctive and contrasting in appearance so as to distinguish such motor vehicles from other motor vehicles and make them easily identifiable.
- Sec. 2. Section 1 shall apply to those motor vehicles used primarily in traffic law enforcement purchased subsequent to the effective date herein and also subsequent to the effective date of any rules and regulations that the commissioner shall establish pursuant to the purposes set forth in Section 1.

# CHAPTER 555—H. F. No. 1849

An act relating to any city of the first class now or hereafter operating under a home rule charter providing for a commission form of government consisting of a mayor, a comptroller, and six commissioners, and authorizing the fixing and payment of the annual salaries of such officials; amending Laws 1949, Chapter 604, Section 1, as amended.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Laws 1949, Chapter 604, Section 1, as amended by Laws 1955, Chapter 702, Section 1, and as amended by Laws 1957, Chapter 933, Section 1, is amended to read:

Section 1. Officers' salaries. Notwithstanding any provision contained in any charter of any city of the first class now or hereafter operating under a home rule charter providing for a commission form of government, consisting of a mayor, a comptroller, and six commissioners, the mayor shall be paid an annual salary of \$10,000, the comptroller shall be paid an annual salary of \$9,500, and the commissioners shall each be paid an annual salary of \$9,000, all payable in equal monthly installments; provided, that the amounts of any such salaries shall be subject to change by virtue of any subsequently enacted and operative applicable special law or by virtue of any subsequently enacted amendment to the Charter of the City of Saint Paul.

#### CHAPTER 556-H. F. No. 1711

## [Not Coded]

An act relating to tax levies by certain counties for the purpose of maintaining and operating the Red River Valley Winter Shows.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Red River Valley Winter Shows, tax levy. The board of county commissioners of the counties of Kittson, Roseau, Marshall, Polk, Red Lake, Norman, and Clearwater may annually levy a tax of not to exceed one-fourth of one mill, in excess of existing limitations, for the sole purpose of maintaining and operating, the Red River Valley Winter Shows and its buildings, facilities, or equipment.
- Sec. 2. This act shall become effective only after its approval by the board of county commissioners of the counties of Kittson, Roseau, Marshall, Polk, Red Lake, Norman, and Clearwater by a majority vote of each.
