Sec. 3. The said City, for the purpose of providing moneys for the payment of its severance pay obligations under any such ordinance, hereby is authorized and empowered, by resolution of its Council, in addition to all other powers possessed by said City and in addition to and in excess of any limitation upon the amount it is otherwise authorized by law to levy as taxes, to levy taxes annually not exceeding in any one year an amount equal to 35/100 of one mill upon each dollar of the assessed valuation thereof, upon all taxable property in said City, exclusive of moneys and credits, which taxes as levied shall be spread upon the tax rolls, and all collections thereof shall be paid into the treasury of said City, therein to be allocated therefor and to be disbursed and expended by said City in payment of any such City severance pay obligations and for no other purpose. The said disbursements and expenditures by said City for payment of such City severance pay obligations hereunder shall not be deemed to constitute any part of the cost of said City's government within the meaning of any Statutory or Charter limitation on said City's expenditures.

Sec. 4. This Act shall become effective only after its approval by a majority of the City Council of the City of Saint Paul, Ramsey County.

CHAPTER 691—H. F. No. 1593

[Coded]

An act relating to salaries of municipal judges and special municipal judges in all municipal courts, excepting municipal courts in cities of the first class; repealing all acts and provisions of law relating to said salaries.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [488.21] Salaries in particular municipalities. Subdivision 1. The annual salary of any judge of a municipal court situated or hereafter established in a city,

village or borough named in this section, shall be as set forth below.

Subd. 3. Any judge of a municipal court situated in a city, village or borough named in this section having conciliation court powers, as prescribed by Minnesota Statutes 1957, Chapter 491, shall receive in addition to the annual salary prescribed in subdivision 2 an annual salary of \$500.

Sec. 2. [488.22] **Special judge; salary, instances when qualified to sit.** Subdivision 1. The salary of any special judge of a municipal court situated in a city, village or borough named in this section shall be \$25 per day.

Subd. 2. A special judge of a municipal court is qualified to sit only in instances when the municipal judge is disqualified or when a municipal judge is physically incapacitated.

Sec. 3. [488.23] **Other courts, salaries of judges.** The salary of any municipal judge of a municipal court now existing or hereafter established and not prescribed in section 1 shall be the sum of \$600 per annum.

Sec. 4. [488.24] **Other courts, salaries of special judges.** The salary of any special municipal judge of a municipal court now existing or hereafter established and not prescribed above shall be the sum of \$25 per day.

Sec. 5. [488.25] **Fees, disposition.** All fees collected by a municipal court shall be deposited with the treasurer of the city, village or borough in which the court is situated for disposition by the governing body thereof.

Sec. 6. [488.26] **Salaries heretofore paid, ratification.** The amount of salaries heretofore paid any municipal judge or special municipal judge is hereby confirmed and ratified.

Sec. 7. This act takes effect from and after the 1st day of July, 1959.

CHAPTER 692—S. F. No. 273
