French Lake, Maple Lake, Marysville, Middleville, Monticello, Otsego, Rockford, Silver Creek, Southside, Stockholm, Victor, and Woodland are granted the power and authority by ordinance to license and regulate the establishment, uses, maintenance, and abandonment of public and private dumping grounds or areas in the boundaries of the respective towns. The regulations shall be based on objectives and standards governing the public health, safety, comfort and well-being of the residents of the towns.

- Subd. 2. The town boards may fix a reasonable fee for the issuance of a license to cover the cost of licensing, regulating, inspecting, and enforcement of the provisions of the ordinance or resolution, and regulations so adopted.
- Subd. 3. Any violation of any ordinance and regulations so adopted is declared to be a public nuisance and may be abated in the manner prescribed by law for the abatement of public nuisances.
- Subd. 4. Any person who violates any ordinance or resolution, and regulations so adopted is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- Sec. 2. This act shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the governing body of the county of Wright, and as to a specific municipality named in section 1, only after its approval by a majority of the governing body of such specific municipality. Such approvals shall comply with Laws 1959, Chapter 368.

## CHAPTER 75—S. F. No. 642

An act relating to the use of motor vehicle dealers' plates; amending Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 168.27, Subdivision 5.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 168.27, Subdivision 5, is amended to read:
- Subd. 5. Plates; distinguishing numbers. The registrar shall issue to every motor vehicle dealer, upon a request from such motor vehicle dealer licensed as provided in sub-

division 1, one pair of number plates displaying a general distinguishing number upon the payment of \$5 to the registrar. The registrar shall also issue to such motor vehicle dealer such additional pair of such number plates as the motor vehicle dealer may request, upon the payment of such motor vehicle dealer to the registrar of the sum of \$5.00 \$5 for each additional pair. Motor vehicles, new and used, bearing such number plates owned by such motor vehicle dealer, may be driven upon the streets and highways of this state by such motor vehicle dealer, or any employee of such motor vehicle dealer, for demonstration purposes, or for any purpose incident to the usual and customary conduct and operation of his business, in which he has been licensed under this section to engage. Motor vehicles, new or used, owned by such motor vehicle dealer and bearing such number plates, may be driven upon the streets and highways for demonstration purposes by any prospective buyer thereof for a period of 48 hours. Any motor truck, new or used, owned by such motor vehicle dealer and bearing the motor vehicle dealer's number plates may be driven upon the streets and highways of this state, for demonstration purposes by any prospective buyer for a period of seven days.

A new motor vehicle sold by such motor vehicle dealer and bearing the motor vehicle dealer's number plates may be driven upon the public streets and highways for a period of 72 hours by the buyer for the purpose of removing the vehicle from this state for registration in another state. Upon the delivery of such new motor vehicle to the buyer or Upon upon the delivery of such motor vehicle or motor truck, new or used, to the prospective buyer for demonstration purposes, the motor vehicle dealer shall deliver to the buyer or prospective buyer, as the case may be, a card or certificate giving the name and address of the motor vehicle dealer, the name and address of such buyer or prospective buyer, and the date and hour of such delivery. Such card or certificate shall be in such form as the registrar may provide to the motor vehicle dealer for such purpose, and shall be carried by such buyer or prospective buyer while driving the motor vehicle or motor truck.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1961.
