An act relating to game and fish; providing for management of muskellunge fishing in certain lakes by the commissioner of conservation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Muskellunge; designation of lakes as habitat. The Commissioner of Conservation, after notice and hearing, may designate not more than ten lakes in the state, each of which is known to be the habitat of muskellunge, and provide special rules and regulations applicable only to these lakes for the management of fishing therein. Such special rules and regulations may include among other things prohibition of darkhouse spearing or angling or both in any one or more of these designated lakes, but must be designed and promulgated solely to further experiment and research in the problems of conservation and propogation of muskellunge in the state.

Sec. 2. The lakes so designated may not exceed in aggregate area 15,000 acres. The authority granted hereby, including rules or regulations promulgated thereunder, shall expire February 15, 1965.

CHAPTER 278-S. F. No. 400

An act empowering the state college board to enact rules and regulations governing the operation and parking of vehicles upon property owned, leased, or occupied by the state colleges, providing personnel for the enforcement thereof, and providing penalties for the violation thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [169.966] State college board to regulate traffic. Subdivision 1. The state college board may from time to time make, adopt, and enforce such rules, regulations, or ordinances not inconsistent with the Highway Traffic Regulation Act, Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 169, as amended, as it may find expedient or necessary relating to
