force or effect; but no such provision in any contract or agreement which is mutually agreed by the parties thereto to be separable from the remaining provisions thereof shall affect the validity and enforceability of such remaining provisions.

Sec. 3. This act shall become effective upon its approval by resolution duly adopted by the common council of the city of Rochester, by the vote of not less than a majority of all its members, and upon compliance with Laws 1959, Chapter 368.

CHAPTER 64-S. F. No. 198

An act relating to drivers licenses; amending Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 171.22, and providing penalties for violations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 171.22, is amended to read:
- 171.22 Unlawful acts, drivers license. It shall be unlawful for any person:
- (1) To display, or cause or permit to be displayed, or have in his possession, any canceled, revoked, suspended, fictitious, or fraudulently altered driver's license; or
- (2) To lend his driver's license to any other person or knowingly permit the use thereof by another; or
- (3) To display or represent as one's own any driver's license not issued to him; or
- (4) To fail or refuse to surrender to the department, upon its lawful demand, any driver's license which has been suspended, revoked, or canceled; or
- (5) To use a false or fictitious name in any application for a driver's license, or to knowingly make a false statement, or to knowingly conceal a material fact, or otherwise commit a fraud in any such application; or
- (6) To alter any driver's license, or to counterfeit or make any fictitious license; or

(7) To take any part of the driver's license examination for another or to permit another to take the examination for him.

Any person convicted of violating subparagraphs 6 or 7 is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 169.201, as amended by Laws 1959, Chapter 521, Section 4, is amended to read:

169.201 Yield sign. The driver of a vehicle approaching a YIELD RIGHT OF WAY sign shall slow to a speed that is reasonable for conditions of traffic and visibility, and stop if necessary, and yield the right of way to any pedestrian legally crossing the roadway on which he is driving, and to all vehicles on the intersection intersecting street or highway which are so close as to constitute an immediate hazard.
