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CHAPTER 73—S. F. No. 311

*An act authorizing the sale of a certain building owned by the state to the city of Duluth.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **State owned building, sale to Duluth.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the commissioner of administration, upon recommendation of the commissioner of highways, shall, by appropriate bill of sale, sell to the City of Duluth, a municipal corporation in the County of St. Louis, the frame building, being personal property as distinguished from realty, owned by the state and situated on Lot 10, Block 2, Highland Gardens, City of Duluth, St. Louis County, Minnesota, which lot is owned by the City of Duluth.

Sec. 2. **Consideration to be agreed upon.** The consideration to be paid by the City of Duluth to the State of Minnesota for said building shall be in such amount as may be mutually agreed upon by the City of Duluth and the commissioner of highways.

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CHAPTER 74—S. F. No. 593

*An act relating to certain towns in Wright county; authorizing the licensing and regulation of dumping grounds, and providing penalties for violations thereof.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Subdivision 1. **Wright county towns, dumping grounds.** The town boards of each of the following towns in Wright County, namely, Albion, Buffalo, Chat-ham, Clearwater, Cokato, Corinna, Frankfort, Franklin,

French Lake, Maple Lake, Marysville, Middleville, Monticello, Otsego, Rockford, Silver Creek, Southside, Stockholm, Victor, and Woodland are granted the power and authority by ordinance to license and regulate the establishment, uses, maintenance, and abandonment of public and private dumping grounds or areas in the boundaries of the respective towns. The regulations shall be based on objectives and standards governing the public health, safety, comfort and well-being of the residents of the towns.

Subd. 2. The town boards may fix a reasonable fee for the issuance of a license to cover the cost of licensing, regulating, inspecting, and enforcement of the provisions of the ordinance or resolution, and regulations so adopted.

Subd. 3. Any violation of any ordinance and regulations so adopted is declared to be a public nuisance and may be abated in the manner prescribed by law for the abatement of public nuisances.

Subd. 4. Any person who violates any ordinance or resolution, and regulations so adopted is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 2. This act shall become effective upon approval by a majority of the governing body of the county of Wright, and as to a specific municipality named in section 1, only after its approval by a majority of the governing body of such specific municipality. Such approvals shall comply with Laws 1959, Chapter 368.
