For the emergency relief of the residents of said city who are in distress from lack of food, clothing, shelter, or warmth or from long continued illness.

Sec. 2. Administration of relief. Such relief shall be administered through a committee appointed by the mayor and confirmed by a majority vote of all the members of said council or governing body, which committee in all cases shall be appointed anew each year and shall serve without compensation. All moneys shall be disbursed from said fund in the same manner as other moneys of the city, provided, however, that all disbursements shall be approved by said committee.

Sec. 3. Effective date. This act shall become effective only after its approval by a majority of the council of the city of South Saint Paul and upon compliance with Laws 1959, Chapter 368.

## CHAPTER 83-S. F. No. 140

[Not Coded]

An act providing for an annual levy for parks, playgrounds, or recreational facilities for the city of South Saint Paul.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. South St. Paul, tax levy, recreational purposes. The council of the city of South Saint Paul, notwithstanding a maximum annual levy in its home rule charter, may levy not to exceed 1.5 mills annually in addition to said 20 mills, for the purpose of developing, operating and maintaining its parks and playgrounds and providing other recreational facilities. All moneys derived from any such additional levy shall be used only for the purposes as herein provided.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This act shall become effective only after its approval by a majority of the council of the city of South Saint Paul and upon compliance with Laws 1959, Chapter 368.
