Sec. 2. This law shall become effective only after its approval by a majority of the governing body of the city of Montevideo, and the governing body of the county of Chippewa, and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 227—H. F. No. 1115

[Not Coded]

An act authorizing the village council of the village of Ruthton to issue and sell general purpose bonds of the village.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Ruthton, village of; general purpose bonds.** The village council of the village of Ruthton is authorized to issue and sell general purpose bonds of the village in an amount not exceeding \$13,000 for the purpose of providing money to pay outstanding obligations of the village for curb and gutter and graveling and to permit the village to operate on a cash basis. The said bonds shall be issued under and pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1961, Chapter 475, but no election shall be required to authorize the issuance of said bonds.

Sec. 2. The only governmental unit to which this act applies is the village of Ruthton and this act shall become effective when approved by a resolution adopted by a majority of the members of the village council of said village and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 228—H. F. No. 1206

An act relating to the village of Holland; authorizing an additional tax levy for general revenue purposes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Holland, village of; general purpose tax levy.** In addition to the tax levies now authorized by law, the village of Holland may levy an additional tax of ten mills on all taxable property within the village for the general purposes and welfare of the village.

Sec. 2. Section 1 is effective upon its approval by a majority of the members of the governing body of the village of Holland and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 229—H. F. No. 248

An act relating to false advertising of insurers not authorized to transact business in this state and providing for actions in this state with respect thereto and for service of process upon such insurers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **[72.41] Unauthorized insurers false advertising process act; purpose of act, construction.** The purpose of this act is to subject to the jurisdiction of the insurance commissioner of this state and to the jurisdiction of the courts of this state insurers not authorized to transact business in this state which place in or send into this state any false advertising designed to induce residents of this state to purchase insurance from insurers not authorized to transact business in this state. The legislature declares it is in the interest of the citizens of this state who purchase insurance from insurers which solicit insurance business in this state in the manner set forth in the preceding sentence that such insurers be subject to the provisions of this act. In furtherance of such state interest, the legislature herein provides a method of substituted service of process upon such insurers and declares that in so doing, it exercises its power to protect its residents and also exercises powers and privileges available to the state by virtue of Public Law 15, 79th Congress of the United States, Chapter 20, 1st Session, S. 340, which declares that the business of insurance and every person engaged therein shall be subject to the laws of the several states; the authority provided herein to be in addition to any existing powers of this state. The provisions of this act shall be liberally construed.
