(3) collecting or receiving in this state any premium for insurance;

and a copy of such statement of charges, notices or process is sent within ten days thereafter by registered mail by or on behalf of the commissioner to the defendant at the last known principal place of business of the defendant, and the defendant's receipt, or the receipt issued by the post office with which the letter is registered, showing the name of the sender of the letter, the name and address of the person to whom the letter is addressed, and the affidavit of the person mailing the same showing a compliance herewith, are filed with the commissioner in the case of any statement of charges or notices, or with the clerk of the court in which such action is pending in the case of any process, on or before the date the defendant is required to appear or within such further time as the court may allow.

- Subd. 4. No cease or desist order under this section shall be entered until the expiration of thirty days from the date of the filing of the affidavit of compliance.
- Subd. 5. Service of process and notice under the provisions of this act shall be in addition to all other methods of service provided by law, and nothing in this act shall limit or prohibit the right to serve any statement of charges, notices or process upon any insurer in any other manner now or hereinafter permitted by law.
- Sec. 6. [72.46] Constitutionality. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or application of the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.
- Sec. 7. [72.47] Short title. This act may be cited as the unauthorized insurers false advertising process act.

An act relating to public employees retirement association; providing survivorship benefits to the widows of certain contract employees.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Public employees retirement association; special benefits. Notwithstanding the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1961, Chapter 353, and any act amendatory thereof to the contrary, a contract employee of a school district who had a contract with a school district for the school term beginning September, 1960, and who died after June 1, 1961, and before July 1, 1961, and who had not less than two years of allowable service, shall be deemed to have been a member of the public employees retirement association on the date of his death, and his widow is eligible for benefits from the fund of the association to the extent provided by Chapter 467 of the Laws of 1961.

Sec. 2. Section 1 is applicable only to a surviving widow who has not remarried on or prior to the effective date of this act.

An act relating to the public employees' retirement association; providing survivorship benefits to the widows of certain school district employees.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Public employees' retirement association; special benefits. Notwithstanding the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1961, Chapter 353, and any act amendatory thereof to the contrary, a contract of an employee of a school district who had the contract with the school district for the school term beginning September, 1960, and who died after August 1, 1961, and before September 1, 1961, and who had not less than 90 months of eligible service, shall be deemed to have been a member of the public employees' retirement association on the date of his death, and his widow is eligible for benefits from the funds of the association.
- Sec. 2. Section 1 is applicable only to a surviving widow who has not remarried prior to the effective date of this act.
