Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minneapolis, city of; tax levy for firemen's relief The governing body of the city of Minneapolis shall each year at the time the tax levies for the support of the city are made, and in addition thereto, levy a tax on all taxable property within the city in an amount to pay the estimated pension costs due and payable by the Minneapolis fire department relief association pursuant to law for the year said pension costs are to be paid, less the proceeds or moneys paid into the special fund of such association pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1961, Chapter 69, or any other provision of law, during said year. Said tax shall in no event exceed 1-3/4 mills. Should the estimated payments from the Minneapolis fire department relief association fund be of such amount as to require a levy in excess of 1-3/4 mills, the contributions by firemen provided for in Minnesota Statutes, Section 69.361, paragraph 1, shall in that year be increased from 3-1/2 percent to 4-1/2 percent. The tax so levied shall be transmitted with other tax levies to the auditor of the county in which the city of Minneapolis is located and shall be collected and payment thereof enforced when and in like manner as state and county taxes are paid. All moneys collected under such levy shall be credited to the special fund of the association. This levy shall not be considered a part of the tax levy under any limitation in the charter of the city of Minneapolis, but shall be in addition to any existing charter or statutory limitation.

- Sec. 2. After the effective date of this act no levy shall be made in the city of Minneapolis under Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 69.36
- Sec. 3. This act shall become effective only after its approval by the majority of the governing body of the city of Minneapolis and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 319-H. F. No. 57

An act relating to towns in the county of Carver; conferring certain village powers on these towns.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Towns in Carver county; village powers. The

following towns in Carver county, namely, Benton, Camden, Chanhassen, Dahlgren, Hancock, Hollywood, Laketown, San Francisco, Waconia, Watertown, and Young America, shall have and possess in addition to all other powers now or hereafter granted said towns, the same power and the same authority now possessed by villages under the laws of this state to acquire, open, and widen any street or road in a platted area or subdivision in the town, and to improve the same by construction, reconstruction, and maintaining pavement, gutter, curbs, and vehicle parking strips of any material, or by grading, graveling, oiling, or paving the same, and the authority to levy special assessments therefor by the procedure set out in Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 429. The town board of supervisors thereof shall be deemed a council as defined in section 429.011, subdivision 3, of such chapter.

Sec. 2. This act takes effect as to each specific town named in section 1 only after its approval by a majority of the town board of supervisors of such town and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 320-H. F. No. 154

An act relating to wild animals; providing for bounties on certain species; amending Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 348.071, Subdivisions 1 and 2.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 348.071, Subdivision 1, is amended to read:

- 348.071 Wild animals; bounties; wolf, lynx, bobcat, fox. Subdivision 1. Every person who shall kill a wild wolf, lynx or bobcat in this state up to and including June 30, 1961 1965, not having at the time spared the life of any other such wolf, lynx or bobcat which he could have killed, shall, upon compliance herewith, be rewarded in the sum of \$35 for each adult timber wolf, \$25 for each cub timber wolf, \$25 for each coyote or brush wolf of any age, and \$15 for each lynx or bobcat regardless of age.
