## CHAPTER 150—H. F. No. 445

An act relating to motor vehicle dealer number plates; amending Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 168.27, Subdivision 5.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 168.27, Subdivision 5, is amended to read:

Motor vehicles; dealer plates; distinguishing num-Subd. 5. The registrar shall issue to every motor vehicle dealer, upon a request from such motor vehicle dealer licensed as provided in subdivision 1, one or more pair of number plates displaying a general distinguishing number upon the payment of \$5 \$10 per pair to the registrar. The registrar shall also issue to such motor vehicle dealer such additional pair of such number plates as the motor vehicle dealer may request, upon the payment of such motor vehicle dealer to the registrar of the sum of \$5 for each additional pair. Motor vehicles; new and used, bearing such number plates owned by such motor vehicle dealer, may be driven upon the streets and highways of this state by such motor vehicle dealer, or any employee of such motor vehicle dealer, for demonstration purposes; or for any purpose incident to the usual and customary conduct and operation of his business; in which he has been licensed under this section to engage: Motor vehicles, new or used, owned by such motor vehicle dealer and bearing such number plates, except vehicles leased to the user, held for hire, or customarily used by the dealer as a tow truck, service truck, or pickup truck, may be driven upon the streets and highways of this state by such motor vehicle dealer, or any employee of such motor vehicle dealer or by any member of the immediate family of such dealer or employee for either private or business purposes; or may be driven upon the streets and highways for demonstration purposes by any prospective buyer thereof for a period of 48 hours. Any or in the case of a motor truck, truck tractor, or semitrailer, new or used, owned by such motor vehicle dealer and bearing the motor vehicle dealer's number plates may be driven upon the streets and highways of this state; for demonstration purposes by any prospective buyer for a period of seven days.

A new motor vehicle sold by such motor vehicle dealer and bearing the motor vehicle dealer's number plates may be driven upon the public streets and highways for a period of 72 hours by the buyer for the purpose of removing the vehicle from this state for registration in another state or for any lawful purpose while pending registration in this state. Upon the delivery of such new

motor vehicle to the buyer or upon the delivery of such motor vehicle or motor truck, truck tractor, or semitrailer, new or used, to the prospective buyer for demonstration purposes, the motor vehicle dealer shall deliver to the buyer or prospective buyer, as the case may be, a card or certificate giving the name and address of the motor vehicle dealer, the name and address of such buyer or prospective buyer, and the date and hour of such delivery. Such card or certificate shall be in such form as the registrar may provide to the motor vehicle dealer for such purpose, and shall be carried by such buyer or prospective buyer while driving the motor vehicle or motor truck, truck tractor, or semitrailer.

Sec. 2. This act is effective on January 1, 1966.

## CHAPTER 151-H. F. No. 678

An act relating to grand lodges of fraternal organizations created by territorial or state laws; authorizing a change in the place of establishment.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Fraternal organizations; place of establishment. Subdivision 1. The grand lodge of any fraternal organization created by a special act of the legislature of the territory or of the state of Minnesota which designated the place of establishment may change the place of establishment thereof by conforming with the provisions of this act.
- Subd. 2. The place of establishment of such grand lodge may be changed from time to time when authorized by a majority of the board of trustees or other governing body thereof and a majority of the members of the grand lodge; and the change shall become effective when a certificate, duly executed by the presiding officer and the secretary of such grand lodge, setting forth the change of the place of establishment and reciting compliance with the provisions of this act, is filed for record in the office of the secretary of state.
