CHAPTER 321-S. F. No. 505
An act relating to blind persons; providing such persons may select practical and suitable vocational training; amending Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 248.07, Subdivision 4.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:
Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 248.07, Subdivision 4 , is amended to read:

Subd. 4. Blind persons; vocational training. The commissioner of public welfare shall endeavor to secure for the adult blind of the state and youths of legal working age such vocational training, labor, and employment as may be adapted to their respective capacity, and shall so far as may be feasible aid such persons in securing any provisions which may be made by the school for the blind or other state agencies for the betterment of their lot. When vocational training under the division of re-education is secured, such aid may take the form of payments for the maintenance of persons in training, under rules to be adopted by the commissioner of public welfare. Any person who shall be entitled to training under this subdivision shall have the right to choose from available programs such training as in his opinion would be suitable and practical for him.

## CHAPTER 322-S. F. No. 896

An act relating to agricultural seeds; limiting the time for certain free tests; amending Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 21.51, Subdivision 7.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:
Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 21.51, Subdivision 7 , is amended to read:

Subd. 7. Agricultural seeds; free tests; purity and germination tests. The commissioner shall provide for purity and germination tests of seeds and identification of seeds and plants for farmers, dealers and others. He may prescribe rules and regulations governing such testing and identification; and may establish and collect suitable charges for testing and identification in excess of the number of free tests and identifications allowed. Every resident of this state shall be entitled to five free tests and identifications each year.
