

Section 1. Duluth, city of; firemen's relief association. A member of the firemen's relief association in the city of Duluth who has completed a period, or periods of service on the fire department equal to 20 years or more, shall, after he has arrived at the age of 50 years, or more, and has retired from the payroll of the fire department, be entitled to a basic pension of not less than 20 units and not more than 32 units per month for his natural life in conformity to the bylaws of such association. Any and all leaves of absence of more than 90 days, except such as are granted to a member because of his disability due to sickness or accident, shall be excluded in computing said period of service; and all periods of time during which a member received a disability pension shall be excluded in such computation. No deductions shall be made for a leave of absence granted to a member to enable him to accept an appointive position in said fire department. No member shall be entitled to draw both a disability and a service pension.

Such monthly basic payments may be increased by adding to said basic pension the sum of one additional unit for each of the first three years of such service in excess of 20 years and one and one half additional units for each year of such service in excess of 23 years. The bylaws of such association may provide for these increases, or any portion thereof; provided, that in no event shall the total pension exceed the sum of 40 units per month.

Said unit shall be $\frac{1}{80}$ th of the maximum monthly salary including longevity of a first-grade firefighter on January 1 of the current calendar year in which the pensions provided for in this act are paid.

Sec. 2. This act shall become effective only after its approval by the city council of the city of Duluth, and upon compliance with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 180—S. F. No. 694

An act authorizing the conveyance by the state of certain land in exchange by the conveyance of certain land to the state, such lands lying and being in the county of Grant.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Conveyance of state lands; Gould-National Batteries, Inc. Subdivision 1. The governor is authorized to convey in the name of the state of Minnesota as grantor to Gould-National Batteries, Inc., a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the state of Delaware, all of the interests and estate of the state of Minnesota in and to the following described land lying and being in Grant county, to-wit:

The West One Thousand Twenty (1020.0) feet of the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Seven (7), Township One Hundred Twenty-Nine (129) North, Range 41 West of the Fifth (5th) P.M., according to the government survey thereof; reserving to the state of Minnesota all gravel and the right to remove such gravel therefrom.

Subd. 2. In consideration of the conveyance of the land by the state as provided in subdivision 1 Gould-National Batteries, Inc. shall convey to the state of Minnesota the following described land located in the county of Grant, to-wit:

A part of Government Lot Six (6) and Lot Seven (7) of Section Seven (7), Township One Hundred Twenty-Nine (129) North, Range Forty-One (41) West of the Fifth (5th) P.M., and more particularly described as follows, to wit: Beginning at the Southwest corner of said Section Seven (7), thence East and along the South line of said Section Seven (7) a distance of Four Hundred Twenty-Three and Twenty-five Hundredths (423.25) feet, thence North $00^{\circ}-46'$ East Four Hundred Ninety-Four and Five Tenths (494.5) feet, thence North $8^{\circ}-20'$ East Four Hundred Thirty-One (431.0) feet, thence North $23^{\circ}-34'$ East Five Hundred Eighty-Eight and Four Tenths (588.4) feet, thence North $32^{\circ}-35'$ East Four Hundred Fifty-Four and Two-Tenths (454.2) feet, thence North $37^{\circ}-15'$ East Sixty-Four and Five-Tenths (64.5) feet, thence North $50^{\circ}-38'$ West Two Hundred and Five and Six-Tenths (205.6) feet, thence North $2^{\circ}-27'$ East Four Hundred and Five and Nine-Tenths (405.9) feet to the shore line of Lake Pomme de Terre, thence westerly and along said shore line thus; South $70^{\circ}-37'$ West Three Hundred Fourteen and Two-Tenths (314.2) feet, thence North $58^{\circ}-05'$ West Three Hundred Sixty-Three and Seven-Tenths (363.7) feet, thence North $32^{\circ}-03'$ West One Hundred Forty-four and Four-Tenths (144.4) feet to the north line of said Government Lot Six (6), thence South $89^{\circ}-55'$ West and along said North line of Lot Six (6) a distance of Two Hundred Eighteen and Five-Tenths (218.5) feet to the Northwest corner of said Lot Six (6), thence South $00^{\circ}-40'$ East along the section line Two Thousand Six

Hundred Thirty-Nine and Forty-Five Hundredths (2,639.45) feet to the point of beginning, according to the government survey thereof. Containing 38.30 acres, more or less.

Subd. 3. The conveyance of the land described in subdivision 2 shall be accepted only after the attorney general has approved the title thereof and has approved the deed of conveyance as to form and execution.

CHAPTER 181—S. F. No. 724

An act relating to the department of conservation; prescribing certain specifications for uniforms for game wardens and supervisors; amending Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 84.086, Subdivision 2. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 84.086, Subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. Game wardens; uniforms; badges.

(a) The commissioner may provide for the issuance at state expense of such badges and uniforms as he may deem necessary and suitable for officers or employees of the department and its divisions.

(b) *Uniforms for game wardens and their supervisors shall be equipped with distinctive emblems, and shall be distinctive from the uniforms of any division or section of the department of conservation, the state highway patrol, or any other state department or agency.*

Sec. 2. *This act takes effect July 1, 1966.*
