An act authorizing the conveyance of certain real estate owned by the state to Medicus, Inc.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:
Section 1. Conveyance of state lands; Medicus, Inc. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the governor, upon the recommendation of the commissioner of highways, may transfer and convey by proper deed of conveyance containing such restrictions and reservations as recommended by the commissioner of highways in the name of and on behalf of the State of Minnesota, to Medicus, Inc., a private corporation, all or any portion of the following described real estate situated in Ramsey County, State of Minnesota, to wit:

That tract of land bounded by College Avenue, Ninth Street, Main Street, and 10th Street in the City of St. Paul.
Sec. 2. The consideration to be paid by Medicus, Inc., to the State of Minnesota for any real estate conveyed hereunder shall be in such amount as may be mutually agreed upon by Medicus, Inc., and the commissioner of highways.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:
Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section 125.08, is amended to read:
125.08 Teachers' certificates; fees. Each application for Changes or additions indicated by italics, deletions by strikeout:
the issuance, renewal, or extension of a certificate to teach; eapplieant for such eertificate shalt pay a fee. For each elementary sehoel limited eertiffeate or renewal thereof the fee shall be $\$ 2$. For eaeh permantent eertifieate the fee stratl be $\$ 10$. For all others, the fee shall be $\$ 3$ for each eertifieate or renewat thereof shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable fee of $\$ 5$. Such fee shall be paid to the commissioner, who shall deposit them with the state treasurer, as provided by law, and report each month to the state auditor the amount of fees collected for eaeh kind of eertifieate.

## CHAPTER 218-H. F. No. 643

An act relating to highway traffic regulations; requiring school buses to be lighted during daylight hours when transporting children; amending Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section I69.48.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:
Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section 169.48, is amended to read:
169.48 School buses; lighting. Every vehicle upon a highway within this state, at any time from a half hour after sunset to a half hour before sunrise and at any other time when there is not sufficient light to render clearly discernible persons and vehicles on the highway at a distance of 500 feet ahead, shall display lighted lamps and illuminating devices, as hereinafter, respectively, required for different classes of vehicles, subject to exceptions with respect to parked vehicles, as hereinafter stated. In addition to the other requirements of this paragraph, every school bus transporting children upon a highway within this state, at any time from a half hour before sunrise to a half hour after sunset, shall display lighted lamps and illuminating devices as required by this paragraph, except that the operator shall use the lower most distribution of light specified in section 169.60 unless conditions warrant otherwise.

When requirement is hereinafter declared as to the distance from which certain lamps and devices shall render objects visible or within which such lamps or devices shall be visible, these provisions shall apply during the time stated in this section upon a straight level unlighted highway under normal atmospheric conditions unless
