Sec. 2. **Promotional employment.** Any veteran in the employment of such city, who seeks promotion to a higher position therein, and has passed the examination therefor, shall have five points added to his passing rate, and if he is a disabled veteran, he shall have an additional five points added thereto, and if he is able to perform the duties of the position which he is seeking, his name with his rating shall be placed on the eligible list for such position, without any further veterans rights.

Sec. 3. **Definitions.** For the purposes of this act, the terms "veteran" and "disabled veteran" shall be given the meaning prescribed therefor in Minnesota Statutes, Section 43.30.

Sec. 4. This act shall become effective only after its approval by the common council of the city of St. Cloud, and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 608-S. F. No. 1121

An act legalizing and validating certain deeds executed by trustees of religious corporations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Religious corporations; deeds; validating. All deeds of real property heretofore executed by the trustees of any religious corporations conveying real property within this state belonging to such corporation which were recorded prior to January 1, 1965, in the office of the register of deeds of the county in which the real estate conveyed is situated, and the record thereof, are hereby legalized, validated and confirmed, nothwithstanding that the church records do not disclose that the execution of such deed was authorized by the congregation of said religious corporation in the manner provided by law.

Sec. 2. Application. This act shall not apply to any action now pending, or which shall be commenced within six months after the passage hereof, in any of the courts of this state wherein the validity of such deed is being litigated.
