

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section 340.14 as amended by Laws 1967, Chapter 19, Section 10, is amended by adding a subdivision to read:

Subd. 4. Sunday liquor sales. (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision 1, in any municipality establishments to which on sale licenses have been issued or hereafter may be issued for the sale of intoxicating liquors which are hotels or restaurants as defined in Laws 1967, Chapter 19, Section 1, and which have facilities for serving not less than 30 guests at one time, may serve intoxicating liquors between the hours of 12 o'clock noon and 12 o'clock midnight on Sundays in conjunction with the serving of food, but no liquor shall be served on Sundays other than to persons who are seated at tables.

(b) It is unlawful for any such establishment, directly or indirectly, to sell or serve such intoxicating liquors as provided in paragraph (a) above, without having first obtained a special license from the municipality therefor. Such special license may be issued by the governing body of the municipality for a period of one year and for such a fee as it shall determine, but not exceeding \$200. The special license may be revoked by the governing body, for cause. The provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 340.112 as amended by Laws 1967, Chapter 19, Section 6 shall apply to such license. Application for the special license shall be made to the governing body of the municipality in the same manner as application for other licenses to sell intoxicating liquor are made.

(c) This subdivision shall not apply to any municipality until authorized by the voters of the municipality voting on the question at a special election called for such purpose or at the general election in the municipality, the election to be conducted in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Minnesota election law.

CHAPTER 692—S. F. No. 709

An act relating to barbers; amending Minnesota Statutes 1965, Sections 154.065, Subdivisions 3 and 6; 154.18; and 154.23.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section 154.065, Subdivision 3, is amended to read:

Changes or additions indicated by italics, deletions by ~~strikeout~~.

Subd. 3. **Barbers; application; fee.** Each applicant for a *an initial* certificate of registration shall make application to the board on blanks prepared and furnished by said board, such application to contain proof under oath of the particular qualifications of such applicant. This application shall be accompanied by a fee of ~~\$10~~ *prescribed by law* to defray the expenses of making investigation and for the examination of such applicant.

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section 154.065, Subdivision 6, is amended to read:

Subd. 6. **Annual registration fee.** Any applicant who has complied with the provisions of this section, shall pay an annual registration fee of ~~\$10~~ *prescribed by law* and thereupon a registration certificate shall be issued to him. Every such registration certificate shall expire on the last day of the year in which it is issued. Every registration may be renewed, without taking any further examination, upon the payment of the annual fee hereinbefore set forth.

All funds collected under this section shall be paid into the general revenue fund.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section 154.18, is amended to read:

154.18 **Fees.** ~~The fee to be paid by an applicant for an examination to determine his fitness to receive a certificate of registration to practice barbering shall be \$10.~~

~~The fee to be paid by an applicant for an examination to determine his fitness to receive a certificate of registration to practice as an apprentice is \$5.~~

~~The fee to be paid for the renewal of a certificate of registration to practice barbering is \$5 and for the restoration of an expired certificate, \$7.~~

~~The fee to be paid for the renewal of a certificate of registration to practice as an apprentice is \$4 and for the restoration of an expired certificate, \$6.~~

The fees for examinations and certificates *collected*, as required in this chapter, shall be paid in advance to the secretary of the board of barber examiners and deposited by him in the state treasury, to be disbursed by the secretary on the order of the chairman in payment of expenses lawfully incurred by the board.

The fees to be paid the board of barber examiners required by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 154, as amended, are:

(4) <i>For restoring certificate of registration as a registered barber within one year of expiration,</i>	\$15;
(5) <i>For examining applicant for a certificate of registration as a registered apprentice,</i>	\$10;
(6) <i>For issuing a certificate of registration as a registered apprentice,</i>	\$7;
(7) <i>For renewing a certificate of registration as a registered apprentice,</i>	\$7;
(8) <i>For restoring a certificate of registration as a registered apprentice, within one year of expiration,</i>	\$10;
(9) <i>For examining applicant for a teacher's certificate,</i>	\$25;
(10) <i>For issuing a certificate of registration as a registered teacher,</i>	\$25;
(11) <i>For renewing a certificate of registration as a registered teacher,</i>	\$25;
(12) <i>For restoring a certificate of shop registration within 30 days after expiration date,</i>	\$7;
(13) <i>For issuing a certificate of registration as an approved barber school,</i>	\$100;
(14) <i>For renewing a certificate of registration as an approved barber school,</i>	\$100;
(15) <i>For issuing a student permit,</i>	\$3;

The fees prescribed above for the renewal of certificates of registration as a registered barber and registered apprentice include the assessment made for the Unfair Trade Practice Act and shall be effective for the renewal of the ~~1947~~ 1968 licenses.

Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section 154.23, is amended to read:

154.23 **Officers; compensation; reports.** The board of bar-

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ber examiners shall elect a chairman and secretary. It shall adopt and use a common seal for the authentication of its orders and records.

The secretary shall keep a record of all proceedings of the board and turn over to the state treasurer all moneys collected at least once a month.

Each member of the board shall give a bond in the sum of \$5,000, with sureties to be approved by the secretary of state, conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties and take the oath provided by law for public officers.

A majority of the board, in meeting duly assembled, may perform and exercise all the duties and powers devolving upon the board.

The secretary shall receive as compensation ~~\$6,000~~ \$9,000 per annum and the other members of the board shall receive a compensation of ~~\$25~~ \$35 per day for each day of actual service, but not to exceed 20 days in any calendar month nor 100 days in any calendar year, in discharge of their duties as such. All members of the board shall receive necessary traveling expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties. Salaries and expenses are to be paid out of the fund created by fees collected in the administration of this chapter. Each member of the board of barber examiners is entitled to sick leave and vacation leave with pay to be computed in the manner prescribed by the civil service rules. Each member shall file monthly with the secretary a complete report showing his activities during the preceding month, stating in detail the places, shops, or schools visited or inspected by the member. On or before October 1 in each even numbered year the board shall make a biennial report to the governor containing a full statement of the receipts and disbursements of the board and a full statement of its doings and proceedings during the preceding two fiscal years, with such recommendations as it may deem expedient.

The board shall have authority to employ such inspectors, clerks, deputies, and other assistants as it may deem necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter.

Any funds in the state treasury to the credit of the present board and a full statement of its doings and proceedings during the able for use by, the board established under the provisions of this chapter.
