The surviving dependent spouse benefit shall terminate upon his or her remarriage, and the dependent children's benefit shall be reduced pro tanto when any child is no longer dependent. *On July 1, 1967, any surviving dependent spouse and each dependent child not receiving the benefits provided in (a) and (b) and the additional \$20 per month as provided, shall be paid said amount.*
