

collection of the taxes authorized to be levied in section 3, to provide funds for the purposes specified in section 1. The certificates shall not be general obligations of the county and the principal thereof and interest thereon shall be payable solely from the tax authorized to be levied in section 3, which tax shall be irrevocably appropriated to a fund to be used solely for the payment of such principal and interest. Except as otherwise provided the certificates shall be issued in accordance with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475.

Sec. 3. To provide funds for the purposes specified in section 2 the board of commissioners may by resolution levy a tax on all taxable property in the county in each of the years 1967 through 1976, collectible in the years 1968 through 1977. The tax in any year shall not exceed a sum equal to one half mill times the assessed value of all taxable property in the county as last finally equalized before the issuance of the bonds. The tax shall not be subject to any other statutory limitation and shall not cause the amounts of other taxes which are subject to any such limitation to be reduced.

Sec. 4. This act shall become effective upon its approval by a majority of the board of commissioners of Goodhue county, and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 786—H. F. No. 2644

An act relating to the county of Le Sueur; setting the rate for tax levies for the road and bridge fund.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Le Sueur county; road and bridge tax levy.** Notwithstanding the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 163.05 or any other provision of law, the board of county commissioners of Le Sueur county may levy taxes for the county road and bridge fund in an amount not more than 38 mills on the dollar of the taxable valuation of the county.

Sec. 2. This act takes effect when approved by the board

CHAPTER 787—H. F. No. 2647

An act relating to state parks, waysides, and recreational reserves; creating new state parks; authorizing additions to existing state parks, waysides, and recreational reserves; establishing and clarifying the boundaries of Jay Cooke state park.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **[85.1871] State parks; establishment of new parks and additions to existing parks, 1967. [Subdivision 1.] Split Rock Lighthouse state park.** Subdivision 1. The commissioner of administration for the commissioner of conservation, is authorized to acquire by gift or purchase, the following described lands in Lake county:

All of government lots 1 and 2, the south half of the southwest quarter, the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter, and the north half of the southeast quarter of section 32; all of government lot 3 of section 33; all in township 55 north, range 8 west of the 4th P.M. All of the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter and government lots 1 and 3, all that part of government lot 2 lying outside of the existing statutory boundary of Split Rock state wayside, all in section 5; all of government lots 1, 2 and 3, the northeast quarter, the north half of the southwest quarter, and the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter, all in section 6; all of government lots 1 and 2 of section 7; all in township 54 north, range 8 west of the 4th P.M.

Subd. 2. The lands acquired pursuant to subdivision 1, together with lands presently constituting Split Rock state scenic wayside, comprise Split Rock Lighthouse state park which is hereby established under the supervision and control of the commissioner of conservation. The lands shall be administered in the same manner as provided for other state parks and shall be perpetually dedicated for such use.

Subd. 3. The revisor of statutes is directed to correct the next edition of Minnesota Statutes as follows to conform to subdi-

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
