

a. For the improvement of trails and portages on established canoe and boat routes dedicated to public use lying wholly or partially within the county.

b. For the cleaning, deepening, widening and straightening of the bed of any river or creek to prevent flooding of lands.

c. To improve navigable lakes within the county and to mark by buoys and other means, reefs and shallow places in such lakes.

Sec. 2. Laws 1927, Chapter 183, Sections 1 to 3; Laws 1929, Chapter 298, Section 1; and Laws 1941, Chapter 49, Section 1, as amended by Laws 1953, Chapter 283, Section 1, are repealed.

Sec. 3. The powers enumerated in section 1 shall be exercised in accordance with the requirements, if any, of chapter 110.

Sec. 4. This act shall become effective upon approval by the board of county commissioners of the county of St. Louis and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 435—H. F. No. 1597

An act relating to education; issuance of teacher certificates; amending Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 125.05; and repealing Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 125.07.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 125.05, is amended to read:

125.05 Teachers; issuance of certificates; state board to issue certificates. *Subdivision 1. Qualifications.* The authority to certify teachers is vested in the state board. Certificates shall be issued to such persons as the state board finds to be physically competent and morally fit to teach. Qualifications of teachers and other professional employees shall be determined by the state board under the rules which it promulgates. Certificates of qualifications of teachers shall be issued by the commissioner and the commissioner shall issue certificates to any qualified blind graduates of a school of education.

Subd. 2. Expiration and renewal. Each certificate shall bear the date of issue. Certificates shall expire and be renewed in accordance with rules promulgated by the state board of education. Renewal requirements for the renewal of a certificate shall include the production of satisfactory evidence of successful teaching experience for at least one school year during the period covered by the certificate in grades or subjects for which the certificate is valid or the completion of such additional preparation as the state board shall prescribe.

Sec. 2. *Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 125.07, is repealed.*

Sec. 3. [125.05] [Subd. 3.] *This act is effective July 1, 1969. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as affecting the validity of a permanent certificate issued prior to July 1, 1969.*

CHAPTER 436—H. F. No. 1609

An act relating to insurance; providing for the continuation of coverage for mentally retarded and physically handicapped dependents under individual family and group health insurance contracts, and medical and hospital service corporation contracts; amending Minnesota Statutes 1967, Chapter 62A, by adding a section; Chapter 159, by adding a section; and Chapter 309, by adding a section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1967, Chapter 62A, is amended by adding a section to read:

[62A.14] **Insurance; coverage of handicapped dependents.** *Subdivision 1. Individual family policies. An individual hospital or medical expense insurance policy delivered or issued for delivery in this state more than 120 days after the effective date of this act, which provides that coverage of a dependent child shall terminate upon attainment of the limiting age for dependent children specified in the policy shall also provide in substance*
